

- Spring LTRs were scheduled for two/day sessions on April 5, 12, 13, 19, 26, and 27. We had to cancel sessions on April 5
 & April 26 due to weather. April 27 was our make-up day.
- In all we had 214 registrants participating
- Of those participating, we had 40% (80 new rowers) sign-up for SRL
- There was an attempt to schedule several Fall LTR sessions, however they had to be cancelled due to difficulty in finding coaches, coxes and volunteers

2025 presented some successes and challenges for coaching at WRRA. Among these were:

- With another record high number of SRL crews, WRRA continued one coach-to-one crew coaching for all teams in 2025. This was due to the usual coaching heroes who took more than their share of the coaching burden, and to the new coaches recruited from out of the ranks of the new U30 Program. Everyone who coached SRL should receive the membership's thanks for a great 2025 season.
- Consistent coaching was again provided for the 2025 Mens' Masters Program by Charles Richardson, the new SRL+ Program (thank you Ellie Townsend and Lincoln Luzar) and the Reserve Master's Program. The Learn to Scull Program was kept on track through the efforts of Patty Travis and Tom Hornick among others.

2025 presented some successes and challenges for coaching at WRRA. Among these were:

- Providing coaching for the 2025 Women's Masters Program proved to be a challenge, with once a week coaching supplied by Kate Krengel beginning about mid-season. Delivering consistent coaching for this program in 2026 is a priority for the Coaching Committee.
- WRRA was able to provide coaching for a Fall Rowing League Program as well as a HOTC Prep Program in 2025. We hope to be able to build on this success for 2026.
