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FALL 2025-26 HOCKEY FORMAT

Silver Mites

Silver Mites is specifically designed for 5-, 6-, and 7-year-olds who are new to hockey and usually have completed a Learn to Skate program. They are average skaters that may possess the skill to play at a higher level but may not be able to understand all the rules and concepts or have the maturity for competition in a game setting.

This level will not focus on how to run a power play or working on different line combinations. Instead, it will concentrate on skill development. Players will receive jerseys and socks and games will be cross-ice.

We plan to have multiple Silver Mite teams with limited rosters that will practice together on Wednesday or Thursday early evenings and Saturdays and play half-ice games on Sunday mornings. Evaluations are \$50 and the program itself costs \$754 for the fall session, which runs from September until the end of December. Please note that the number of teams is subject to change. Players selected for the program will be directed to register after evaluations to pay their fees.

Chicago United Hockey League

The Phantoms will practice and play their home games at the Darien Sportsplex. Our travel mite teams will compete in the Chicago United Hockey League (CUHL). The CUHL will offer a full season of full-ice games, plus round robin playoffs, from September to March. Tournaments for mite travel teams will be in addition to their regular season games.

Central States Developmental Hockey League

The CSDHL is a highly competitive league specifically designed for elite Tier II hockey teams within Illinois and the Central States region.

Girls Hockey Teams

This season the Hawks will be fielding competitive all-girls teams at the 10U, 12U, 14U, 16U & 19U levels. Girls tryouts are in mid-August. AHA! rules allowed national-bound girls team tryouts to be held in June. All tryouts are only for girls who wish to play on girls-only teams. Girls teams will also compete in the Northern Illinois Hockey League (NIHL) Girls Division. The season will include one skating and skills session, two shared practices, and one weekend game slot per weekend plus one weekly off-ice session.

We reserve the right to change leagues to ensure the girls have the best experience possible.

***Double rostering on a non-Hawks girls team and Hawks boys team is not allowed.**

TEAM SELECTION

For the 2025-2026 fall season, the Chicago Hawks will select teams based on talent. We will field birth-year teams as well as combined birth-year teams. While we try to place all players, we do not guarantee that your player will make his/her desired league and/or team. He/she may be placed at a lower level that we feel is better suited for his/her skill level. Any player who does not get placed on a travel team will have an opportunity to play in the Darien In-House DHL program. The evaluations for the In-House program will take place in September.

ICE STRUCTURE

*The typical weekly breakdown of ice for our teams is the following:

Darien House League: One combined practice and one weekend game per week. This is a Darien Park District in-house program run by the Chicago Hawks.

8U - CUHL: Two skating and skills sessions, one shared practice, weekend game slot

10U: One skating and skills session, two shared practices, weekend game slot

12U: One skating and skills session, one rollover and one shared practice, weekend game slot

14U: One shared and one rollover practice, rotating shared practice, weekend game slot

16U: One shared and one rollover practice, rotating full ice practice, weekend game slots

18U: Two full ice practice slots, weekend game slots

Girls Teams:

Girls U10: One skating and skills practice, two shared practices, weekend game slot

Girls U12, U14, U16, U19:

One skating and skills practice, one rollover and one shared practice, weekend game slot

**We realize that Darien Sportsplex hosts many tournaments and events over the course of the season which at times will affect our weekly slots. We have already taken this into account when we determine players' fees. There will be times during the season that teams may have access to additional ice.*

***While we will make every effort to follow the proposed ice structure, please be aware the ice structure is subject to change based upon multiple factors including, but not limited to, the number of teams formed, coaching availability, and any unforeseen issues.*

WEEKLY PROGRAM FOR TEAMS

Monday Night Training

Skating and skill development will be offered this year to ensure that no more than two teams are on the ice together per session.

Practices

Practice plans are designed to develop the player's skills, build confidence to use these skills, teach the game of hockey and, most importantly, grow the love of the game in your player. We want to provide an environment that will bring out the best in every player.

Games

Our goal is to help your player succeed while at the same time challenging and teaching him/her how to deal with adversity. We want our players to develop a sense of fair play and good sportsmanship. You can expect at least one game per week and, in some instances, two.

Chicago Hawks Goaltending Academy

At the heart of our goaltending department is one simple truth: We want our goalies to love the game and position. We create an environment where goalies are inspired, supported, and passionate about playing the great game of hockey. We believe that goaltending is both an art and a science; requiring technical precision, mental toughness, and hockey intelligence. Our department is led by experienced goalie coaches who specialize in teaching the foundations of the position while also advancing each goalie's ability to read the game, anticipate plays, and react with confidence. From beginner goalies learning the basics to advanced netminders looking to take the next step in the goaltending journey, our curriculum is built to make every goalie in our program the best version of themselves.

Key Features of Our Program:

The **Monday Night Goalie Academy** is a high-intensity, skill-focused training workshop designed to elevate goaltenders of all ages and skill levels. Held weekly, the academy provides structured, professional coaching in a competitive and supportive environment. Stations are led by experienced coaches, including former collegiate and professional players, our academy delivers the best on-ice training tailored to each goalie's personal needs.

Mental Skills Academy - Our Mental Skills Academy equips goalies with the psychological tools they need to thrive under pressure, bounce back from adversity, and maintain consistency throughout the season. Through structured virtual and in person workshops, one on one coaching, and on-ice reinforcement, we teach goalies how to train their minds with the same discipline as their bodies.

CHICAGO HAWKS HOCKEY CLUB POLICIES

Social Media Policy

The Chicago Hawks Hockey Club ("Club") is committed to developing individuals with "leadership, commitment and outstanding character" on and off the ice. To that end, we will require strict adherence to the following social media and electronics communications policy by all Club members, coaches, and their families as a condition of their participation in the Club:

The Club will not tolerate its members participating in any form of electronic communication that is deemed by its Rules and Ethics Committee to be derogatory, hateful, vengeful, or otherwise disrespectful to the Club, any member of the Club, any coach of the Club, or any other person(s) associated with any other hockey club or organization. This includes, but is not limited to, communications deemed harmful to the goodwill or reputation of the Club, any member of the Club, any coach of the Club, or any other person(s) associated with any other hockey club or organization. This further includes, but is not limited to, sending a text or email about the Club, any member of the Club, any coach of the Club, or any other person(s) associated with any other hockey club or organization that is intended to abuse, bully, humiliate, or harass.

Any communications that are deemed to violate this policy will be reviewed by the Club's Rules and Ethics Committee for possible sanctions up to and including expulsion from the Club and further reporting to AHAI.

Equipment & Uniform Policy

The Chicago Hawks require red helmets for players on all teams (excluding In-House, Silver Mites, and goalies). Players who do not have the required red helmet by 10/01/2025 will not be allowed to play in league and/or tournament games.

Players have the option of reusing their current jerseys OR purchasing a new set.

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Season fees will cover the cost of the Uniform Kit (home and away game socks, pant shells, and a warm up jacket and pants.) When the uniform order is placed, you will have the option to purchase additional items, such as extra game socks.

The Midget teams will be given a winter coat and two pairs of home and two pairs of away socks as part of their uniform kit. Each player will be given one coat during their time in the midget program. If a new coat is needed it can be purchased separately.

Practice Jerseys and practice socks can be reused this season. If you are new to the Club, your practice jersey and socks will be provided to you. Any returning players that need a new jersey or practice socks will be required to purchase them..

If any items need to be replaced throughout the season they will also need to be purchased.

Summer fitting dates will be announced as they are scheduled. You are not required to attend a fitting date if you know what sizes you need to order.

Refunds will only be provided for jersey purchases of players who have not been **OFFERED** a roster spot within the Chicago Hawks Hockey Club and any of its affiliate programs including, but not limited to, the Girls and Phantoms programs.

All jersey number conflicts will continue to be resolved in favor of the longest-tenured player with the most consecutive years in the Club. In the event two or more players with the same number are placed on the same team, the player(s) with less longevity will be required to change their number. Depending on the numbered jerseys the Club has in stock, a player may incur the cost of an additional set of jerseys.

All new players to the Club, including first-year mites, will be assigned a number based on availability and numbers already in use. Uniform numbers will be assigned based on the previous years numbers, new number requests may not be honored and are assigned at the discretion of the Equipment Manager.

Any uniform questions prior to being placed on a team can be directed to the equipment manager, Nick Skweres, at equipmentmanager@chicagohawks.com. After you are placed on a team you will refer all questions to your team manager.

Logo Policy

The Chicago Hawks' and Darien Phantoms' logo are the property of the organization and Club approval is required for its use. All Chicago Hawks and Darien Phantoms logo merchandise must be coordinated through our Equipment Manager Nick Skweres. If there is a desire to create an item with the Chicago Hawks or Darien Phantoms logo, managers must contact Nick and he will assist you with the request. SafeSport

USA Hockey requires all players 17 years of age or older on or before December 31st of that playing season and who play on a team in a classification that allows minor aged players to complete SafeSport Training before being added to a team and prior to participation with the team (on-ice or off-ice). This requirement applies to all teams in the age classifications Youth, Girls, High School, Junior Hockey, Flex Hockey and Disabled Hockey programs that allow both minor age and adult age players (anyone over 18 years). Players in the group identified above that have not completed the SafeSport Training cannot be placed on the team's roster in the USA Hockey registration portal (where rosters are created).

Injury Policy

The Hawks/Phantoms injury policy allows a proration of fees to any player who is off the ice for a period greater than six weeks due to an injury that occurs on-ice during a Hawks or Phantoms game or practice. A note from a medical doctor confirming the injury is required. COVID-19 diagnoses/absences are not included and therefore not eligible for a refund under this policy. Only one injury refund is allowed per player per season regardless of whether the subsequent injury is a recurrence of the first injury or a completely new/different injury.

For purposes of the refund policy, we assume that the season starts September 1 and ends on the last day of February – so a 181-day season. For example, if a family paid \$2,000 for their

player for the season, it breaks down to \$11.04/day. If the player is injured and misses seven weeks of hockey, you are entitled to a \$540.96 refund (49 days X \$11.04/day).

Baseline Concussion Testing Requirement

Starting in the 2025-2026 season, all baseline testing will be conducted online for all players. This testing will be done through IMPACT and will be very similar to previous years.

After players are assigned to rosters, parents will be provided with a link to complete the IMPACT test for their players at home. Each link will be unique to each team. If you have multiple players on different teams, you will need to use the unique code for the player on the corresponding team.

Once completed, you will be provided a code that can be later used by healthcare providers to compare baseline to post concussion testing as long as that healthcare provider is IMPACT certified

Once provided with the link following team placements, players will have 1 week to complete the baseline test.

Return-to-Play Policy

Any player, who in the opinion of a coach, athletic trainer, or physician exhibits any signs, symptoms, or behavior consistent with a concussion (such as loss of consciousness, headache, dizziness, confusion, or balance problems) shall be immediately removed from play and practice. The player may not return to play and/or practice without written clearance by a qualified healthcare professional. The written clearance must be on the USA Hockey Concussion Management Return to Play Form which can be provided by the coach or manager. This form must be completed and signed by the qualified healthcare professional, signed by the parents, and signed by the coach. The completed forms shall be turned into the team manager.

USA Hockey Concussion Information

All sports and free play are associated with risk for a concussion, including playing, officiating or participating in ice hockey. It is important that all participants and parents learn about concussion prevention, recognition, treatment and return to play. A concussion is a type of traumatic brain injury-or TBI- caused by a bump or blow to the head or by a hit to the body that causes the head and brain to move quickly back and forth. Bouncing or twisting of the brain in the skull can cause chemical changes and sometimes stretching of the brain cells. A concussion disrupts the way the brain normally works. Most concussions are mild, but all concussions should be taken seriously because permanent brain damage and death can occur from another injury. A concussion may be difficult to recognize. A player does not have to be "knocked-out" to have a concussion- less than 10% of players actually lose consciousness. Signs and symptoms may show up right after the injury or can take hours or days to fully appear. If a person reports one or more symptoms or demonstrates any signs of concussion

after a blow to the head or body, s/he should be kept out of practice, play or training immediately and referred to a healthcare professional with experience in concussion management. A concussed brain needs time to heal and the person is much more likely to have another concussion if they return too soon. Repeat concussions are usually more severe and take longer to heal. Return to play is allowed only after the individual is without symptoms, has progressed through the concussion protocol and is cleared by the health care professional. USA Hockey provides all participants with information and educational materials about concussions, including the risk of sustaining a concussion, how to minimize these risks, concussion signs and symptoms, and USA Hockey's program for returning to play following a concussion. Refund Policy

Tryout/Evaluation fees as well as all player fee agreements and payments are final and non-refundable.

NSF Fee and Declined Debit/Credit Cards

If a check is returned from the bank for any reason, the participant will be charged an additional \$40 reprocessing fee. If a credit or debit card is declined for any reason, the participant will be charged an additional \$40 reprocessing fee.

Financial Policy for Separated or Divorced Parents or Legal Guardians

If a player's parents or legal guardian/s have decided to split player fees, as in the case of separation, divorce, or legal guardianship, it is their responsibility to determine which parent/legal guardian will pay and to handle any issues regarding reimbursement to the other party on their own. **The club will not collect "half" from each parent/legal guardian unless it is presented as payment in full upon registration.**

Family Relief Fund

The Chicago Hawks Hockey Club established the Family Relief Fund (FRF) to assist families needing financial assistance with hockey fees. Families who are temporarily struggling to pay fees as a result of a job loss or other financial crisis may apply for fee relief. Aid from the FRF is designed to be short-term and to offset a portion of a player's fees. For current FRF application procedures and additional guidelines, please email at hawkspresident@chicagohawks.com. All applications for the Family Relief Fund must be submitted by October 15, 2025.

Multi-Player Discount Program

For the fall/winter 2025-2026 season, the Chicago Hawks will again offer a multi-player discount program to families in good standing. For families with multiple travel skaters, the second and subsequent players are eligible to receive a discount to their registration fee per the table below. To be eligible for this program, each player must be on a Darien Phantoms team or Chicago Hawks CSDHL, Prospects or Girls team. Silver Mites and in-house players do not count toward and are not eligible for discount consideration. All discounts will be calculated using the lowest fee paid. All discounts will be calculated against the lesser fee(s) paid per the following table:

Hawks Skater - \$350

Hawks Goalie - \$250

Phantoms Skater - \$250

Phantoms Goalie - \$150

As an example, if a family has a Hawks CSDHL Squirt skater and a Phantoms goalie, they would receive a \$150 discount based on the lesser fees paid for the Phantoms goalie.

The discount will be paid to eligible families at the conclusion of the season via either a credit back to their original method of payment or a check.. NOTE: Should the season be interrupted or canceled for any reason, no multi-player rebates will be issued.

Any family not in good standing with the Club or their team's slush fund is automatically ineligible for discount consideration.

Slush Fund Policy

- **Chicago United Hockey League (CUHL) Slush Fund Policy** - The parent/guardian of the player agrees to pay their player's portion of the team's slush fund. The slush fund can cover a variety of team expenses including, but not limited to, scorekeepers for regular season games, qualified coaching travel expenses, playoff-related expenses, scrimmage games, referee costs, coaches' gifts, practice jerseys, team parties, and tournaments. The parent/guardian also agrees to pay their portion of tournament-related expenses. Please be prepared - some teams may choose to participate in tournaments early in the season, as early as the end of September. Tournaments can be either local and/or out of state/country which will be determined by the majority of the team or head coach. The parent/guardian is responsible for paying their portion of the tournament fees and non-parent head coach's hotel room and qualified travel expenses. If the team has a non-parent assistant coach, the assistant coach's hotel room and qualified travel expenses will also be covered by the team. Hotel expenses will also apply to league games out of town. (Maximum of two coaches' hotel rooms per tournament/league games). Parent/guardian will pay their portion of the slush fund regardless of whether their player is able to participate in the tournament(s). Payment will be made to the team manager.

- **Northern Illinois Hockey League (NIHL) Slush Fund Policy** - The parent/guardian of the player agrees to pay their player's portion of the team's slush fund. The slush fund can cover a variety of team expenses including, but not limited to, scorekeepers for regular season games, qualified coaching travel expenses, playoff-related expenses like Blackhawk Cup and NIHL Blackhawks Tournament games, scrimmage games, referee costs, coaches' gifts, practice jerseys, team parties, and tournaments. The parent/guardian also agrees to pay their portion of tournament-related expenses. Please be prepared - some teams may choose to participate in tournaments early in the season, as early as the end of September. Tournaments can be either local and/or out of state/country which will be determined by the majority of the team or head coach. The parent/guardian is responsible for paying their portion of the tournament fees and non-parent head coach's hotel room and qualified travel expenses. If the team has a non-parent assistant coach, the assistant coach's hotel room and qualified travel expenses will also be covered by the team. Hotel expenses will also apply to league games out of town. (Maximum of two coaches' hotel rooms per tournament/league games). Parent/guardian will pay their portion of the slush fund regardless of whether their player is able to participate in the tournament(s). Payment will be made to the team manager.
- **Central States Developmental Hockey League (CSDHL) Slush Fund Policy** - The parent/guardian of the player agrees to pay their player's portion of the team's slush fund. The slush fund can cover a variety of team expenses including, but not limited to, scorekeepers and trainers for regular season games, qualified coaching travel expenses, playoff-related expenses like Blackhawk Cup and playoff games, scrimmage games, referee costs, coaches' gifts, practice jerseys, team parties, and tournaments. The parent/guardian also agrees to pay their portion of tournament/league game-related expenses. Please be prepared - some teams may participate in tournaments/league games out of town early in the season, as early as September. Tournaments/league games can be either local and/or out of state/country which will be determined by the league, majority of the team, or head coach. The parent/guardian is responsible for paying their portion of the tournament fees and non-parent head coach's hotel room and qualified travel expenses. If the team has a non-parent assistant coach, the assistant coach's hotel room and qualified travel expenses will also be covered by the team. Hotel expenses will also apply to league games out of town. (Maximum of two coaches' hotel rooms per tournament/league games). Parent/guardian will pay their portion of the slush fund regardless of whether their player is able to participate in the tournament(s)/league games. Payment will be made to the team manager.
- **Midget Teams & Girls National Bound Teams** - It is always the goal to keep slush fund expenses as minimal as possible. Please be aware that due to rising costs of team events, tournaments/showcases, travel, and various other slush fund expenses, slush fund requirements may approach or exceed a \$1,000 contribution per player this season. Our costs remain in line with other area clubs.
- **For All Players** - If at any time during the current season the parent/guardian cannot/will not pay the slush funds due to the manager, their player will NOT be able to

practice or play in any scheduled games. The player will not be able to participate until payment has been made or an arrangement has been approved by the Chicago Hawks Hockey Club Board of Directors. If a head coach is a parent, grandparent, or other relative of a player on the team, the team is not required to pay for the head coach's travel expenses and/or hotel room(s). This shall be the case so long as the head coach and respective player share a hotel room.

- **Fundraising** - Any team fundraising efforts need to be approved by the CHHC Board before these activities begin.

CHICAGO HAWKS HOCKEY CLUB VOLUNTEER POLICY 2025-2026

Each Hawk Squirt, Peewee, Bantam, and Midget family is required to donate eight (8) hours of their time at Chicago Hawks Hockey Club event(s) or pay a buy-out fee of \$300. NOTE: If a family has a Peewee, Bantam, or Midget player AND another player at either the Mite or Squirt level, that family must complete eight (8) hours to fulfill the Volunteer Obligation Policy.

As part of the registration, Families are required to agree to either work the required hours, or opt out, and pay \$300.00 to waive the volunteer requirement. **If you agree to work your hours, your credit card will be charged \$1.00 during registration which allows us to hold your credit card information should you not complete your hours. Should you not fulfill your volunteer hours by March 1st, 2025 your credit card will be charged \$400.00.** This fee will not be prorated for partial completion of hours. Failure to work the volunteer hours or pay the \$400 fee will result in a hold placed on your account for the following season, and your player(s) will not be allowed on the ice until the past season's debt is settled.

Volunteer slots are added throughout the season. The volunteer commitment and fee are per family, not per player. Volunteer hours are awarded for support of the Hawks Hockey Club programs and not for team specific functions. DIBS hours are not transferable to other families. Volunteer slots must be fulfilled by adults unless otherwise specified in the description. The one exception to this requirement is Learn to Skate "on ice" help, which ONLY Peewee-Midget level Hawks players are eligible to assist. If you have any questions regarding volunteering, please consult the CHHC Volunteer Policy or email the club President hawkspresident@chicagohawks.com.

To secure this obligation, the Chicago Hawks Hockey Club offers two choices to our Hawks families:

1. I make a commitment to the Chicago Hawks Volunteer Program. I agree to make a separate \$1 credit card payment which will hold my credit card on file. I understand my credit card will be charged \$400 on March 1st, 2025 if we do not complete the 8 volunteer hours by February 28th, 2026.
2. I/we waive our volunteer obligation to the Hawks by choosing the volunteer buyout

option. I/we agree to pay the \$300 fee to the Volunteer Program after team selection at the time of player registration for the 2025-2026 season. I understand that this is non-refundable. I understand that this \$300 will not be refunded even in circumstances where a player/family completes 8 hours of volunteer hours.

No skater will be allowed to take the ice for conditioning, evaluations, and/or tryouts if they do not meet the registration requirements.

Tryout fees will not be refunded for any reason. However, if the player gets reassigned, there will not be a second tryout fee collected.

There will be a \$40 reprocessing fee charged for all returned checks and/or declined credit cards.
