



CODE OF CONDUCT

Parents / Guardians

- Support your child's love of the game — keep hockey fun and player-centered.
- Encourage your child to play by the rules and demonstrate good sportsmanship.
- Model positive behavior — children learn by watching adults.
- Avoid yelling at players, coaches, officials, or other spectators.
- Emphasize effort, learning, and skill development over outcomes.
- Respect officials and support their role in the game.
- Celebrate effort, teamwork, and growth in both wins and losses.
- Never engage in verbal or physical abuse toward any participant.
- Respect and support coaches and volunteers — they are essential to the program's success.
- Communicate concerns appropriately through established program channels.

Spectators

- Show respect to all players, coaches, officials, volunteers, and fellow spectators.
- Display good sportsmanship at all times.
- Cheer positively — encourage effort and fair play.
- Do not taunt, boo, or use profanity or inappropriate gestures.
- Help maintain a safe environment — do not throw objects or interfere with play.
- Do not lean on, pound on, or misuse rink glass or facility equipment.
- Respect locker rooms and team spaces as private areas.
- Trust officials and coaches to do their jobs.
- Be supportive after every game — win or lose.
