<sup>3.</sup> Drop rating is the weight of the bat. Drop rating is calculated by subtracting the weight of the bat from the length (Example: a 30-inch bat that weighs 20-ounces is a drop 10 (-10) bat. A 30-inch bat that weighs 18-ounces is a drop 12 (-12) bat.

<sup>4.</sup> Solid wood bats are permitted at any level (bamboo bats are not permitted).
