2026-27 FEE OVERVIEW



Questions related to player accounts should be directed to accountant@cchockey.org

- **Implemented 3% Core Fees increase for 2026/27 season**
 - Increased to account for cost increases + anticipatory future increases
 - Tournament fees increased 6% on average (\$100/tournament)
 - Ice Rates increased 2% for 26/27 (expected to continue increasing)
 - Account for loss of Concessions at CCC
- **No Raffle for 2026/2027**
- **AA and A players will be assessed additional fee after team selection**
 - \$300 for AA, \$150 for A
 - Additional ice time, increased D6 fees; paid non-parent coaches; higher tournament entry fees; etc.
 - CCHA does reserve the right to assess teams at EOY if necessary
- **Fundraising is important!**



UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS



- Official Uniform Colors
- **BLACK** Helmet, Gloves, Pants/Shell



BLACK

BLACK/WHITE



- Applies to all “Upper” level players
 - Squirt/10U, Pee wee/12U, Bantam/15U
- **NOT** Applicable to goalie helmets, pads and gloves



VOLUNTEER HOURS



- Volunteer Coordinator
 - Kelly Olson: volunteer.coordinator@cchockey.org
- Upper Level Volunteer Requirements
 - 12 hours per player, Family Max of 20 Hours
- Mandatory Volunteer Deposit
 - \$750 per player / \$1,500 per family (2+ players)
 - Buy-out option (\$750 / player or \$1,500 per family)
 - **Deposits are REQUIRED at the first skate of tryout.**
 - **Your player cannot tryout without it!!**
- DIBS – no shows will be penalized at \$125.00 per hour
- Any family completing hours must complete at least one concession shift. Team staff (managers, treasurer, etc.) and coaches are exempt.

LOCKER ROOM MONITORS



USA Hockey SafeSport Locker Room Policy Requirements:

“All Member Programs shall publish locker room policies to the parents of all Minor Athletes that are specific to the Facilities they regularly use. The Member Program’s policies shall include the program’s (a) practices for supervising and monitoring locker rooms and changing areas; (b) permission or lack of permission for parents to be in the locker rooms; (c) prohibited conduct, including at least all forms of abuse and misconduct prohibited by USA Hockey; and (d) specific policies regarding the use of mobile electronic devices and phones and prohibiting the use of a device’s recording capabilities. A sample locker room policy form may be found at usahockey.com/safesportprogram.

For each team, the coach and/or team administrators shall be responsible for compliance with the locker room supervision requirements of this Policy. A coach and/or team administrator that fails to take appropriate steps to ensure the Locker Room Policy is adhered to, and any USA Hockey Participant or parent of a Minor Athlete who otherwise violates this Policy is subject to appropriate disciplinary action; moreover, an Affiliate may impose fines or other sanctions against any Member Program whose teams do not comply with this Locker Room Policy.”

Please note: Sample policies, quick reference guides, and other documents from USA Hockey are tools to help Associations build a suitable locker room policy, but it is up to the Association to establish their own Policy.



LOCKER ROOM MONITORS



- **Reminder of updates made to the CCHA Locker Room Policy:**
 - Clarification that Coaches can serve as locker room monitors - Previously only parents.
 - Establish clear roles of coaches, team managers, and parent locker room monitors
 - Communicate Parent Requirements to comply with USA Hockey SafeSport
 - Read the new policy: [Chaska Chanhassen Hockey Association | CCHA Policies](#)
- **Key Requirements / Rules:**
 - Coaches CAN be Locker Room Monitors
 - At least one locker room monitor must be present for all games, practices, and scrimmages
 - Locker room monitors must comply with USA Hockey SafeSport - Training & Background checks

Parents: It is your responsibility to find a replacement if you are unable to cover your locker room monitor shift .

- **What this means for you:**
 - Girls Levels - Moms will likely cover locker room monitoring duties - Get your requirements done!
 - Coaches will determine whether parents or coaches will serve as Locker Room Monitors for their teams
 - Parents:
 - Register with CCHA Team Volunteer Registration (requires USA Hockey Number)
 - Complete USA Hockey SafeSport Training
 - Complete Background Check

CODE OF CONDUCT



**Code of Conduct forms are required
for all coaches, parents, & players.**

Note: All Code of Conduct forms are captured in the registration process.

- Remember that playing hockey in the CCHA is a **privilege**, not a right!
- Referees reserve the right to remove parents from games for misconduct.
- The “**24 Hour Rule**” is strictly enforced for any complaints.
- Violations by a player may result in probation, suspension or CCHA membership refusal per Article 6 of MN Hockey Bylaws.
- Violations may be enforced by head coach, team manager, level commissioners or CCHA Board of Directors.

TEAM SLUSH FUNDS



Slush funds are intended for covering miscellaneous variable team expenses and enhance team experience during the season.

- Per CCHA rules, **slush funds are capped at \$250 per player** unless otherwise approved by the CCHA board.
- **Team Treasurer** is responsible for maintaining fund and reporting expenditures / budget to all families on team. (No Venmo to Manage)
- All families on team have equal vote on setting slush fund amount and all expenditures for the season.
- CCHA Board reserves the right to intervene if team slush fund requirements are deemed to be “excessive”.
 - *While all families are expected to participate in funding team slush funds, please be cognizant that not all families are in the same financial position. Fund amounts should be reasonable.*

JERSEYS AND SOCKS

A New Approach to Jerseys

Goal: Have jerseys on time

What we changed:

- Selected a new vendor, prioritizing timeliness and quality
- Offered structured **in-person jersey fitting** opportunities
- Moved the entire jersey process **ahead of tryouts**

What to expect:

- Jersey sizing
 - Ordered using the size collected during registration process
 - Try-on opportunities provided to select correct size
 - Once jerseys are in production, changes cannot be made
 - Changes needed after initial production will be at the expense and responsibility of the player.



JERSEYS AND SOCKS

What to expect - continued:

- Jersey Numbers
 - Players submit their top 3 number choices
 - Every effort is made honor these choices but it is impossible to guarantee
 - If preferred numbers are not available, a number will be assigned
 - Criteria considered in assigning numbers includes:
 1. Returning, second-year players in their respective level receive priority where applicable
 2. Allow assigning duplicate numbers in the same level if there is a gap of two or more levels (or one level in Squirts) from the prior year team placement
 - a. Ex. if a prior year PeeWee C player and a prior year PeeWee B1 player request the same number, both players may receive the number.
 - b. Duplicate numbers on the same teams may happen. These will be handled on a case by case basis to correct.
 3. Earliest to register will be used when no other “tie-breaking” criteria prevails

Reminder - This method is intended to ensure jerseys can be delivered on time!



JERSEYS AND SOCKS

What to expect - continued:

- **Currently In Production**
 - Practice jerseys for Upper Levels
 - Game jerseys and socks for Upper Levels (except Girls 15U)
- **Production Pending**
 - Lower Levels and Girls 15U - planned for early October
 - Production priority given to Upper Levels due to season start dates
- **After Tryouts**
 - Team rosters finalized
 - Practice jerseys, game jerseys and socks will be organized and provided to Coaches/Team Manager for distribution to players
 - Currently on track for delivery shortly after teams are rostered



JERSEYS AND SOCKS

- **Lower Levels (Rookies, Mites, Girls 6U and 8U)**
 - **Reversible jersey with one set of knit socks**
- **Upper Levels (Squirts, PeeWees, Bantams, Jr. Gold, Girls 10U, 12U and 15U)**
 - **Practice Jerseys**
 - **Reversible (white/black) for skaters and goalies**
 - **Numbers**
 - **Game Jerseys and Socks**
 - **Hybrid- combination of embroidered tackle twill logos, numbers, and American flag patch with sublimation for added color (i.e stripes, sponsor names, etc.)**
 - **Socks are sublimated stripes**

Evaluation Check In & Rules

(Highlights Only)

- **Pick up Pinny at Check In;**
 - Return Pinny after **Last** Assigned Tryout Session
 - Player responsible for bringing pinny to every session!
 - If Pinnys are not turned in you will not receive a jersey and are responsible for the cost to replace the pinny
- **CCHA Colors** (Jerseys; Socks; Equipment)
 - **No names visible and remove non-CCHA Helmet Stickers**
- **Neck Guards & Mouth Guards Required (D6/USA Hockey Rule)**
- Evaluations are **CLOSED**
 - Parents are **not** allowed to observe.
 - You are not allowed to be a locker room monitor for your child's tryout level.
 - Any player can **opt out** of the evaluation process and be placed on the C team
 - *please notify your Level Commissioner in advance if you plan to opt out.*
- **Final Team Assignments are Posted after Tryouts End**
- **Bring Volunteer Check to First Tryout**



TRYOUTS



- **Tryout Scoring Determines Team Placement**
 - Every ice touch is an opportunity to be evaluated
- **All Tryout Information posted on CCHA [Tryout](#) Webpage.**
 - *Note: Check the Tryout Page often as information is subject to change.*
- All **conflicts, illness, or injuries** need to be communicated to your Level Commissioner **prior** to next scheduled tryout session.
- **Code of conduct violations** during tryouts may result in removal of player from tryouts and scores of ZERO on missed days.
- **Tryout Evaluators- Continued Fortis Evaluators Presence**

NO Parent is to Interact with Evaluators; Tryout Committee or HDC during tryouts.

- All communications, questions, or concerns are to be directed to your **Level Commissioner** who will bring in additional resources as necessary.
