Official Recruitment & Retention

- HUGE win that we only had one game cancellation
- Games Cancelled due to refs
 - 1 Varsity Games, 0 JV
 - 8 solo games 5 Varsity, 4 JV
 - 0 Youth games
 - 4 solo games at 12U & 14U
- The schedule was much more balanced this year with less teams moving games into the back half

Improving League Culture

- Misconduct Yellow Card protocol
 - Fewer misconduct yellows & NO RED
 - 6 yellows
- Youth Game Reports
 - Over 100 responses
 - Mostly very positive
 - The games where we had feedback from the referees on the conduct of team/coach/sideline often did not have game reports
- Parent/Player/Coach Code of Conduct
 - Outlined consequences for misbehavior by fans

Reminder of Off-Season – SUMMER

Summer Season shall be from the end of In-Season until Labor Day.

- B. During Summer Season, coaches may conduct lacrosse activities on their own, as individuals, or as part of a lacrosse program.
- C. During Summer Season, coaches may conduct lacrosse activities with players from their In-Season team and with players from other teams and programs.
- D. Participation by players in Summer Season activities or on a Summer Season team shall not be a requirement or condition of participation on a WSLA In-Season team.

Reminder of Off-Season – Fall/Winter

Out-of-Season shall be from the day after Labor Day until the beginning of In-Season.

- B. During Out-of-Season, coaches may coach players that participate on teams that do not feed directly to the In-Season team they coach.
- C. During Out-of-Season, High School coaches, may coach, conduct practices or instructional clinics for youth players that feed directly into the In-Season team they coach as long as all out of season opportunities are concluded no later than MLK Holiday of any given year.
- D. During Out-of-Season, coaches, paid or volunteer, may coach or conduct practices or conduct instructional clinics for present In-Season team members ONLY under the following conditions:
 - Any Out of Season team, skill clinic or other lacrosse opportunity is open to all players in WSLA and is published on the WSLA website;
 - Any Out of Season team, skill clinic or other lacrosse opportunity is published on the WSLA website at least 7 days before the event date
 - All Out of Season High School Opportunities are concluded no later than the Martin Luther King Holiday
 of any given year. Youth activities for the purpose of team recruitment may be held if approved by WSLA.
