 - o \$26,464 is current balance
 - Got bonuses out to girls officials (~\$650 total)

- Girls Division Change Proposal Alex Kramer
 - Waunakee
 - Voiced support for 10u/12u/14u divisions.
 - 8u they typically don't recruit so will need to see what happens
 - Sauk
 - Don't think the have enough girls to field 3 age levels.
 - Will likely only have teams in 10u/14u age levels
 - o Madison
 - Planning to have 12U team practice with 14Us
 - Proposal
 - Maybe large clubs do 12U, and other clubs with less girls stick to 10U and 14U divisions
 - Clubs with 12U teams would have modified schedule where they do some just 12U-only games, but then split back to 10U and 14U for some other games
 - Each club looks at numbers in February and makes call about what divisions to put teams into. Scheduler will determine schedule based on club identified mix.
 - Need to finalize baseline rules but could be modified for games where kid count is low.
 - If not enough 12U teams, clubs expressed that they didnt want keep playing same teams over and over again.
 - General agreement to try and field 12U teams, but we will look at # of teams and kids.
 - Clubs should provide feedback to scheduler on quality of 12U team to determine if they play against 10u or 14u teams
 - No objections voiced. Proposal accepted. BLA will work to the above proposal with noted flexibility for clubs
- Walk On Items All Clubs
 - Girls Helmets
 - Waunakee wanted to understand clubs' approaches to helmets
 - Deforest provides helmets to its girls.
 - If club provides helmets, they typically need to be recertified every couple of years, or you open yourself up to liability
 - USA LAX mandates for boys, but not for girls (at any age level).

Girls Division Change Proposal

Proposal:

For the 2025 season and forward, Girls Youth Lacrosse will transition from 2 divisions to 3 divisions.

Current Divisions	Proposed Divisions**
10U (1 st grade to 5 th grade)	8U (1 st grade to 2 nd grade)
14U (6 th grade to 8 th grade)	10U (3 rd grade to 4 th grade)
	12U (5 th grade to 6 th grade)
	14U (7 th grade to 8 th grade)

^{** -} If a club is not able to put together a team at a certain age level, the program can have girls play up, and in very specific circumstances, allow them to play down, based on size, experience, etc.

Rationale

Balanced Competition

With our current split, we have 8th graders playing against 6th graders, and 5th playing against 3rd graders, and in some cases 2nd and 1st graders. With that 5th-8th grade being a time that girls are going through puberty, you start to see a big discrepancy in the size, speed and athleticism. This hurts the girls chances to find success in the sport which impacts their level of enjoyment, and ultimately brings me to the next point of player retention.

Player Retention

By having more age-appropriate division, the level of enjoyment will ultimately go up, and we will see a high retention rate for girls teams. Many clubs we do a great job of recruiting new players, but struggle to keep new 6th graders, and new 3rd-2nd grades in the program primarily based on the fact that they are outsized in their division.

Incentivized Growth

Although there will be growing pains by switching back to this age split, it will now incentivize programs to put together more teams. If teams are not able to put together a team at a certain age level, we shouldn't stop programs from having girls play up, and in very specific circumstances, allow them to play down, based on size, experience, etc.
