BLA Youth Lacrosse Sportsmanship Rules

For Players

1. **Respect Everyone** – Treat teammates, opponents, coaches, and officials with courtesy.
2. **Play Fair** – Follow the rules of lacrosse; no cheating, taunting, or unsportsmanlike conduct.
3. **Positive Attitude** – Encourage teammates and stay calm under pressure.
4. **No Trash Talk** – Avoid negative comments toward opponents or officials.
5. **Safety First** – No intentional rough play or actions that could cause injury.

For Coaches

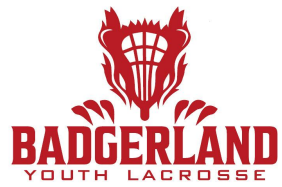
1. **Lead by Example** – Model respect and integrity for players and parents.
2. **Encourage Effort Over Outcome** – Focus on improvement and teamwork, not just winning.
3. **Respect Officials** – Disagree respectfully; never argue calls during games.
4. **Promote Inclusion** – Ensure all players feel valued and supported.
5. **Zero Tolerance for Abuse** – No yelling, intimidation, or negative behavior toward players or referees.

For Parents & Spectators

1. **Cheer Positively** – Support all players, not just your child.
2. **Respect Officials & Coaches** – Do not confront referees or coaches during games.
3. **Set the Right Example** – Show good sportsmanship from the sidelines.
4. **Keep Perspective** – Remember: It's about fun, learning, and growth—not just winning.
5. **No Sideline Coaching** – Allow coaches to do their job.

Consequences for Violations

- **First Offense:** Verbal warning
- **Second Offense:** Removal from game or field.
- **Repeated Offenses:** Possible suspension from future games or events.



Officials and Rules

- Clubs are responsible for paying officials before or after the game.
- Fees shall be split between the two clubs involved in the game

* **Ball:** If the teams practice with regular/real balls and are comfortable with them, they are allowed if both teams/coaches agree

+ **Face-offs:** If the teams have practiced face-offs (especially towards the end of the season or as the kids are getting ready for 10U), it is allowed if agreed to by coaches

¥ **Game time:** Depending on team size and coach's discretion, longer games are allowed as long as it doesn't interfere with upcoming games and coaches agree

Girls Rules

All ages:

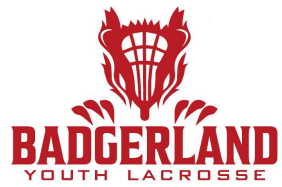
- Use hard balls and require full head gear (goggles or helmets) and mouth guards, players may also wear close fitting gloves if desired
 - Mercy rule at 4+ goal differential, the losing team starts with the ball at center field, all players are 4M away
 - The sphere for 14U and under is 12"
 - On the fly substitution allowed for all ages
 - Stick check may be requested at any time
1. Deputy goalkeeper is a defensive player entering the circle to tend goal if the goalie steps out
 2. All games are run time, clock only stops for team timeouts and injury timeouts
 3. Teams may call a timeout when they have possession, all players must drop sticks where they are, at end of timeout player pauses before self start
 4. Game pauses, player must go back behind the restraining line but not turnover. Offside for 12U and 14U requires turnover.
 5. Closely guarded rule states that a player may not hold the ball for more than 3 seconds if they are closely guarded, defense has both hands on the stick and if they player could be checked if checking is allowed. This is only applicable in the midfield and is used when a player is no longer progressing down the field.

Our goal is to move away from only having 10U and 14U teams. This is heavily dependent on numbers across clubs, coordination, and getting girls involved earlier in lacrosse

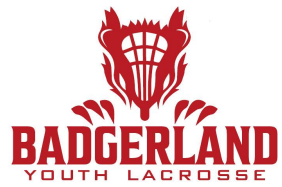
8U:

- Players receive a stick, goggles and pinnie from BLA per the \$25 registration fee
- Program runs April 20th- June 1st, with two 1.5 hour practices per week and scrimmages as appropriate.
- Suggested minimum group is 10 players
- if a club has 10+ players, they can have their own team, but we may still ask them to accept players from neighboring clubs

12U:

- As lacrosse grows in Dane County we need to expand our age group options for girls
- Last year we had our first year of 12U and we would like to expand it this year.

BOYS' FIELD PLAYER EQUIPMENT

Required Equipment

1. HELMET

- » Statement/seal indicating it meets NOCSAE lacrosse standard performance specification and SEI certified



2. FIELD PLAYERS CROSSE (Stick)

- » Short Crosse - 40-42"
- » Long Crosse - 52-72"
- » 10U and younger has allowances for shorter stick lengths (please reference the USA Lacrosse Boys' Youth Rules Book).

3. GLOVES

- » Hand must be fully inserted in glove

4. SHOES

- » Athletic cleats or athletic shoes

5. PROTECTIVE CUP

- » Fitted for comfort & protection
- » Garments to improve comfort include: supporters, all-in-one briefs & combinations of both

6. ARM PADS

- » Elbow should be properly & completely covered

7. SHOULDER PADS

- » Covers top of shoulder, collarbone & sternum
- » Should fit comfortably; adjust by loosening/tightening straps
- » NOTE: NOCSAE ND 200 compliant shoulder pads will be mandatory as of January 1, 2022



8. MOUTHGUARD

- » Must be visible color other than clear or white
- » Self-molding (from manufacturers) or custom-molded (from dentist)



Optional Equipment

9. RIB PADS (NOT SHOWN)

- » Covers the ribs and kidneys; adjust by loosening/tightening straps
- » Should fit comfortably, not restricting breathing



BOYS' GOALIE EQUIPMENT

Required Equipment

1. HELMET

- » Statement/seal indicating it meets NOCSAE lacrosse standard performance specification and SEI certified

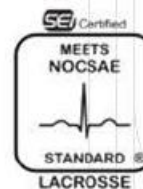


2. THROAT GUARD

- » Separate from helmet & required for goalies
- » Attach with snaps/screws/other fasteners
- » Proper fit for helmet & guard must be done relying on manufacturers' guidelines & requirements on their website or included with helmet/guard

3. CHEST PROTECTOR **

- » Covers front torso, neckline to below navel
- » Body straps must be secured to the front of pad - adjust for a snug, comfortable fit



4. PROTECTIVE CUP

- » Fitted for comfort & protection
- » Garments to improve comfort include: supporters, all-in-one briefs & combinations of both

5. SHOES

- » Athletic cleats or athletic shoes

6. GOALIE GLOVES

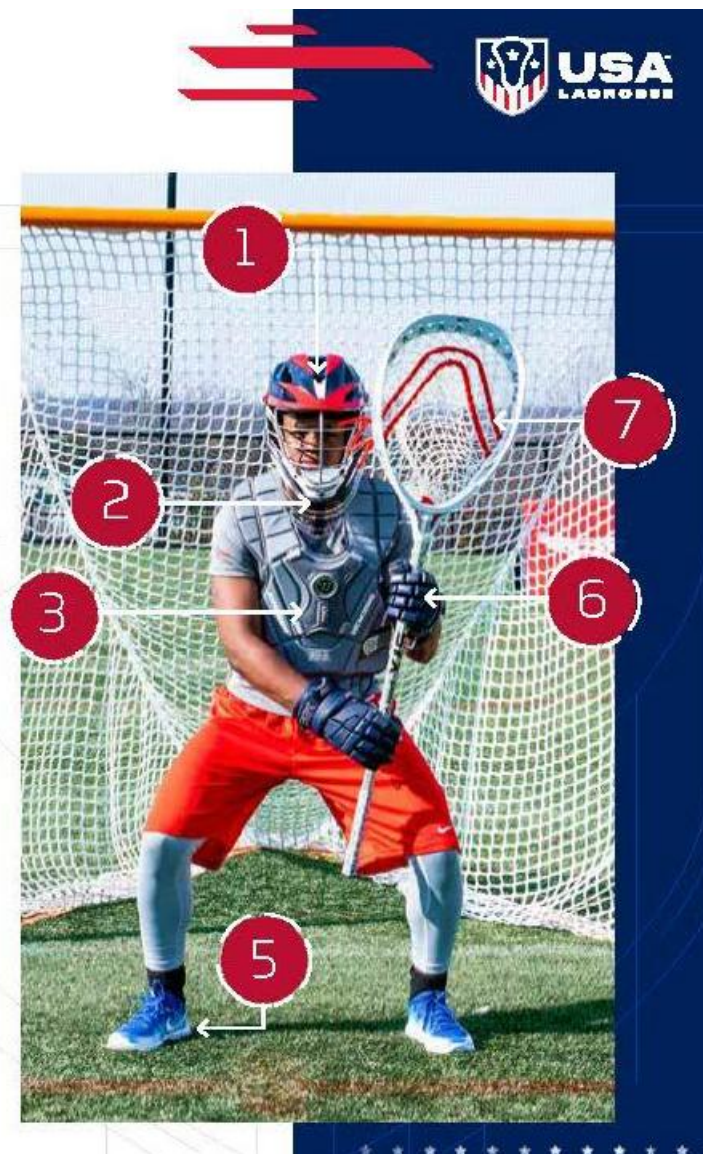
- » Hand must be fully inserted in glove
- » Includes goalie specific additional thumb protection

7. GOALIE CROSSE

- » Length 40 - 72"
- » NOTE: 10U and younger has allowances for shorter stick lengths (please reference the USA Lacrosse Boys' Youth Rules Book).

8. MOUTHGUARD

- » Must be visible color other than clear or white
- » Self-molding (from manufacturers) or custom-molded (from dentist)

GIRLS' FIELD PLAYER EQUIPMENT

Required Equipment

1. GOGGLES

- » Meets the current ASTM standard for women's lacrosse eyewear;
- » SEI certified and bears the SEI mark.
- » SEI Website seinet.org/search.htm#§ion=hidden-us_lacrosse



2. CROSSE

- » Must adhere to Rule 2 Section 2 and meet the manufacturers specifications (Appendix B)
- » Legal Sticks- uslacrosse.com/legal-womens-sticks

3. MOUTHGUARD

- » Must be visible color other than clear or white
- » Self-molding (from manufacturers) or custom-molded (from dentist)



Optional Equipment

4. GLOVES

- » Must be close-fitting & should be comfortable for player while holding a stick.



5. HEADGEAR

- » Meets current ASTM standard for women's lacrosse headgear and has permanent SEI certification mark.
- » If it includes integrated eyewear, it must also meet that current ASTM standard.



GIRLS' GOALIE EQUIPMENT

Required Equipment

1. HELMET

- » Statement/seal indicating it meets NOCSAE lacrosse standard
- » performance specification and SEI certified

2. THROAT GUARD

- » Separate from helmet & required for goalies
- » Attach with snaps/screw/s/other fasteners
- » Proper fit for helmet & guard must be done relying on manufacturers' guidelines & requirements on their website or included with helmet/guard

3. CHEST PROTECTOR **

- » Covers front torso, neckline to below navel
- » Body straps must be secured to the front of pad
- adjust for a snug, comfortable fit
- » SEI WEBSITE

4. GOALIE GLOVES

- » Hand must be fully inserted in glove
- » Includes goalie specific additional thumb protection

5. LEG PADS

- » Must protect shins and thighs
- » May not use field hockey goalie pads

6. PELVIC and ABDOMINAL PROTECTION

- » Generally incorporated as a part of thigh padding

7. CROSSE

- » Must adhere to Rule 2 Section 3, Appendix B
- » Legal Stick List - uslacrosse.com/legal-womens-sticks

8. MOUTHGUARD

- » Must be visible color other than clear or white
- » Self-molding (from manufacturers) or custom-molded (from dentist)

Optional Equipment

9. SHOULDER PADS

- » Covers top of shoulder, collarbone & sternum
- » Should fit comfortably; adjust by loosening/tightening straps



**Starting with the 2021 season, goalies MUST wear goalkeeper chest protectors which meet the NOCSAE INC200 lacrosse standards at the time of manufacture.
