  - \* Circling back with last years Mite / 8U Refs that haven't indicated that they are participating again this year
  - \* Pay is \$30 per game (same as LY)
  - \* No siblings are allowed to referee Mite / 8U games unless they have registered as an official with USA Hockey, registered with CP as an official, and have a USA crest sewn on their jersey. No exceptions.
  - \* Recent Mite / 8U Ref clinic at Andover, a couple of our officials participated
  - \* We had 1 of our Mite / 8U officials participate in the recent 2 day District Officiating Seminar at Andover. I think she learned a ton and did a great job participating during the seminar!

- Parent Question to Hockey Ops:
  - Will there be transparency of tryout scores after tryouts? Coaches will provide development feedback during the season. Not looking to have evaluators share feedback as it is used for team placement not development feedback.

- Why are coaches not able to provide their input for teams? We want evaluators who do not
  have ties to the association to make decisions like that to keep it objective. Also, parents are not
  allowed in to keep it objective.
- Concern of a gap between PeeWee AA, B2 and C team placement: Have not fully decided on team placements yet. It won't be final until after tryouts. We have until 10/17 to declare to D10. With our District, there are many associations that have B1 as their top team. Looking at that as a competition stand point and trying to make the 2<sup>nd</sup> team at PeeWee level competitive with other districts.
