	<p>Action Items In-progress/Pending:</p> <p>Final numbers for the 2025-2026 ice hockey season. \$35,135.50 Split was 55% card and 45% cash Final cleaning is completed. Concessions is shut down for the season.</p> <p>Questions for the board/larger group:</p> <p>Other Notes:</p> <p>I want to say “Thank You” to the association for all the years that we have been entrusted with the operations of the concession stand. We took over these operations coming out of COVID lockdown and have seen some amazing changes in the 5 years that we have operated it. We recognize that there were many plans that we did not get to realize, but are also very proud of the process improvements that we have been able to complete. There are only so many hours for projects in a given year!</p> <p>A few notes for the board to consider:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. New iPads are going to be needed. The current ones have served CPYHA well for 5+ years and they are no longer able to be kept current. That will create a security gap and will eventually mean that Square cannot be kept up to date on them either. I would suggest that funding be put aside to review either new iPads or moving to Square hardware for the fall. 2. This year has been a challenge and we have noticed substantial “shrink” in specific inventory that we were keeping stock levels very accurate. If product is walking out / being consumed or eaten, then it is not a far step to money walking out the door as well. I would suggest that CPYHA invest in a subscription based, video surveillance... something like Ring or another service. 3. The popcorn machine will likely need to be replaced in the next year or two. I would suggest that this get done before the current one is unable to be repaired. Popcorn is a constant seller and having the machine down would cause significant customer satisfaction. 4. I would like to ask that the board avoid the “removal” of cash from our concession stand. This is a popular trend that we have noticed in other rinks (being card only). We never adopted this stance because we felt strongly that cash based transactions were an important learning tool for our youth. This used the concession stand as a learning opportunity to understand the value of money; beyond a simple “tap to pay”. It allowed a child; some as young as mites, to have the independence to approach and purchase their slushy or ring pop without needing Mom or Dad present and doing it for them. This independence is what hockey teaches our kids on the ice, and we need to allow them that same freedom off the ice. <p>THANK YOU AGAIN FOR ALL THE YEARS OF TRUST! We will miss the role and I look forward to seeing what changes and improvements come next fall.</p>
