UPDATED MITE REQUIREMENTS

- FLHA has realigned its Mites levels to be consistent with other associations, ensuring our kids play against others of the same age and ability.
- Please refer to the chart below for guidelines on Mites levels, including birthdate, age, and grade level.

Hockey Level	Ages	Typical Hockey and School Age Level Dates of Birth	Grade Level This Fall	Years of Hockey Experience
JR Rangers	4 to 6	Varies	Pre-K / K / 1st	None
Mini Mites	Ages 5 to 6	6/1/2018 - 5/31/2019	Kindergarten	Some / Able to Skate
Mites 1 and 8U 1	Ages 6 to 7	6/1/2017 - 5/31/2018	1st Grade	1 yr recommended
Mites 2 and 8U 2	Ages 7 to 8	6/1/2016 - 5/31/2017	2nd Grade	2 yr recommended
Mites 3/4 and 8U 3/4	Ages 8 to 9	6/1/2015 - 5/31/2016	3rd Grade	3 yr recommended

REGISTRATION GUIDANCE & AGE CLASSIFICATIONS



- When registering, consider your child's grade level, age, and abilities.
- MN Hockey aligns age classifications with school cutoffs rather than birth year, allowing kids to play with their school friends. For example, a 5-year-old kindergartner with a summer birthday can play with classmates throughout their youth hockey journey.
- Returning Mites may stay at the same level as last year or move based on their progress.
- All Mite players will be evaluated at the start of the season to ensure they are placed at the appropriate level. Adjustments may be made during the season by the Mite director.
- We aim to place kids on teams to fit their abilities, enable them to compete, and ensure your child is having fun while playing hockey

VOLUNTEER PROGRAM HOURS

- Combines both DIBs and concessions into one program for easier management and tracking
- Offers flexibility to choose concession hours or DIBs, or a combination of both.
- Volunteer hours are tracked hourly making fulfillment and planning easier.
- Register separately for volunteer hours when completing fall registration by clicking [HERE](#). Doing so is a requirement to receive your jersey and participate in tryouts.



**NEW NECK GUARDS
REQUIREMENT**
Effective August 1st

- USA Hockey approved legislation requiring the use of neck laceration protection (neck guards) for players in all age classifications, other than adults.
- The new rule goes into effect August 1, 2024.
- Don't forget to purchase a neck guard for your child.
