Field The home team is responsible for providing game equipment. This includes

Equipment: (a) defibrillator, (b) bases, (c) pitcher's plate and (d) game balls. The home

team keeps the balls at the end of the game.

Bats: Wood bats only. Metal, composite and bamboo bats are prohibited. There

are no restrictions on barrel size for baseball bats. Softball bats shall not exceed 34" or 38 oz. and barrels may be no larger than 2 1/4" in diameter.

Baseball bats may not be used for softball.

Footwear: Metal spikes are prohibited. Rubber soled shoes with or without plastic cleats

are permitted.

Protective Gear: All hitters (including on deck hitters), baserunners and players coaching bases

shall wear batting helmets when on the field.

Pitchers shall wear PPBA-approved head protection. This includes ball cap

liners or batting helmets. Softball pitchers must also wear a protective face

guard.

Fighting: Fighting between players warrants an automatic ejection for all involved

parties.

Conduct: Aggressive behavior, including foul or abusive language toward players,

umpires, coaches or other spectators will not be tolerated and shall be grounds

for ejection.

Coaches are responsible for the conduct of their players, parents and fans.

Ejections: Any player, coach, parent or other spectator ejected from a game will

automatically be suspended from the next game. Two ejections in a season

may result in a permanent ban from the league.

Cheering: Players, coaches and spectators may not taunt, negatively criticize or distract

players from the opposing team. Root for you team, not against the

opposition.

Umpires: Only the Head Coach may confer with an umpire. Head coaches may

respectfully question the interpretation of rules, but judgment calls may not be

challenged.

Dugouts: If there is ever a dispute, the home team shall occupy the first base dugout.

Lineups: Coaches shall exchange lineup cards prior to the start of a game.

Parents: Except for parent-coaches, parents are not permitted on the field or in the

dugout during games.

Post-Game: Players and coaches must shake hands (Stanley Cup-style) after every game.
