- First "end" (5 arrows) at each distance are warm-up arrows (these arrows are not

The Filer Family

• The next 15 arrows (3 ends) at each distance are scored (total 30 scoring arrows).

CALCULATING TEAM SCORES

• As per NASP scoring protocol, team scores are calculated using the top 12 scores from each team: 4 scores from each gender M/F (total of 8 scores), and the next 4 highest scores regardless of gender (total of 12 scores). A perfect team score is 3600.




