Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs):

Early Bird Discount?

Please use the code “**EARLYBIRD**” during registration (pricing section) before **April 30th** for \$50 off of your registration.

What happens if practice is cancelled due to weather?

Safety comes first. If weather forces a cancellation, families will be notified immediately through our team app and email. When possible, we schedule a make-up session or shift the practice to the following day.

When will we know the schedule for the tournament?

Tournament schedules are released by the event organizers, typically the **week** of the event. As soon as we receive the schedule, we push it out through our app, email, and our online team dashboard.

What skill level is legacy?

Legacy Lacrosse is designed for motivated players seeking high-level instruction, player development, and competitive opportunities. We welcome a range of skill levels, but players must demonstrate focus, effort, and a desire to improve. It is recommended you have 1 season minimum of playing experience. All teams will have collegiate level coaching. Those interested in guidance for college recruiting will also be helped.

Do players need to try out?

Legacy does not run a traditional high-pressure tryout. Instead, we offer a free “First Look” evaluation (May 20th) session where players can experience our coaching and culture firsthand while we get to know their skill set, effort, and attitude. If we have enough committed players for a team, those evaluations help us place athletes appropriately and shape the roster. Our goal is to build competitive teams while also giving every motivated athlete a real opportunity to show they belong.

What do the fees include?

Program fees typically cover professional coaching, practice facility rentals, player development resources, administrative operations, program apparel, and tournament entry fees (when applicable).

What isn't included?

Travel, lodging, meals, and optional merchandise are not included in registration. Uniforms are Added into the total cost of registration and will be ordered by May 1st.

Do you offer scholarships or financial aid?

We believe cost should never be the reason a player can't play. Legacy offers limited financial assistance based on need and availability. Please reach out directly to indianalegacylacrosse@gmail.com.



Do families handle their own lodging?

Yes. Families are responsible for travel and lodging. For certain tournaments, we may provide hotel block information to help families stay together.

How does Legacy communicate with families?

All communication flows through our team app, email, social media and website. We keep information organized, timely, and transparent so families always know what's coming next.

What is expected of parents?

We ask parents to model sportsmanship, support all players and coaches, and help foster a positive environment. All game-day questions or concerns should go through our staff—not referees or opposing teams. Volunteer opportunities are available for families interested in helping out for tournaments or assisting with an optional team bonding opportunity.

What equipment is required?

Players must have a full set of NOCSAE-approved lacrosse equipment: helmet, gloves, shoulder pads, elbow pads, stick, mouthguard, cleats/turf shoes, and a water bottle. What is your refund policy?

Refunds are considered on a case-by-case basis for injuries or relocations before the start of the season. Once teams are formed and tournament fees are paid, refunds are limited due to fixed program costs. Because tournaments depend so much on the number of players we have for each team attending, we require a minimum 72-hour notice if you are no longer attending a tournament in order to get a 50% refund. This provides coaches with a chance to find a last-minute replacement for the tournament.

Will my child get equal playing time?

Legacy balances development and competition. Playing time is earned through effort, attitude, and performance. All players will have meaningful opportunities to grow, but equal minutes are not guaranteed in competitive events. There are a limited number of positions on the field. Players that are willing to be versatile/flexible and be ready for multiple positions could get more playing time.

We provide college-level coaching, a development-first approach, and we are a professional organization. We are committed to bringing Southern Indiana a high-level development lacrosse program. We have roots and experience in the area going back to the start in 2006. We are a program dedicated to keeping costs low and accessibility to the sport a priority. We understand the various challenges in the community for growing the game of lacrosse and we are passionate about overcoming these challenges.

Can my player also play on other teams?

Absolutely. We support multi-sport and multi-team athletes as long as schedules and commitments are communicated up front. We ask players to prioritize Legacy events during the active season. We recommend talking to the other program you are considering and making an informed decision.

What if I can only make one of the tournaments?

During registration, we will confirm your availability for the tournaments planned. We structure and prioritize having a travel team roster with players who can attend both tournaments planned. Please contact indianalegacylacrosse@gmail.com for more case by case scenarios regarding this topic.

What can I expect of a tournament weekend?

- Plan to arrive 45 minutes before each game and go behind the game field bench-side.
- The coaching staff will meet you for a pre-game warmup.
- Parking close to the fields fill up quickly. Drop the kid off, or get there early.
- Tournaments often release schedules the week of, and adjustments can happen day-of.
- Weather Variability: Heat, Rain, Wind. Weather delays could force games to be shortened.
- Player Essentials: Gear, Water Jug, Shade, Cooling Towel.
- Parent Essentials: Portable Chair, Umbrella, Sunscreen, Portable Phone Charger.
- There are concessions and bathrooms at the tournament.
- There is always an app available for the tournaments we attend with information on schedules, brackets, etc. We will communicate what app each tournament is using to families ahead of time.
