Coach-Parent-Player Code of Conduct

Reminders:

- ◇ These are **kids** NOT professional athletes
- ◇ Coaches are **VOLUNTEERS**
- ◇ Bad calls WILL happen; Exercise **Self-Control** and **Respect** the Umpires
- ◇ **Be a role model**: don't make negative comments about the coaches, the umpires, other players or the other team
- ◇ Observe a **24-hour** cool down rule
- ◇ It's a game, **be positive** and **encouraging!**

TRAVEL LEAGUE

AGES 9-14

- ◆ Tryouts for team placement
- ◆ We do not turn away ball players. If a player does not make a travel team, they are invited to join the community league
- ◆ Player's age levels based on their age as of May 1st, 2026 or their grade during the 2025-2026 school year
- ◆ Teams of 10-12 Players
- ◆ Travel levels are AAA, AA, A
- ◆ Levels for each age group are depending on the number of registrations, tryout results, and previous year's results

Travel League Ages 9U-14U:

Age Group	Teams for 2026	Age as of May 1, 2026	Grade 2025-2026 school year
9U	AAA, A	9 yrs old	3rd grade
10U	AAA, A	10 yrs old	4th grade
11U	AAA, A	11 yrs old	5th grade
12U	AA, A	12 yrs old	6th grade
13U	AA, A	13 yrs old	7th grade
14U	AA	14 yrs old	8th grade

- ◆ Players who are young for their grade may play up an age level to play with their grade. Players may NOT play down an age level.
- ◆ 9U Travel Team: 8-yr old's may try-out for 9U travel but may NOT take a roster spot of a 9-yr old (unless it is determined by tryout evaluations that it is unsafe for the 9-yr old to play on the 9U travel).

- ◇ **Practice:** 2-3 x per week (reduced during game weeks)
- ◇ **League Games:** 14 weeknight games mid April - June (1/2 @ Home Field)
- ◇ **Playoff Games:** July (single elimination)
- ◇ **Tournaments:** 4 weekend tournaments
- ◇ **State Tournaments:** Qualify by placing at weekend tournament(s). **If you qualify, you are required to attend at least 1.** Teams could qualify for up to 2.

Note: Head coaches schedule league games, tournaments are already scheduled by Travel Directors




Travel Team Playing Time

- ◆ Playing time expectations are available on the www.shakopeeyouthbaseball.com website.
- ◆ Please understand that traveling baseball is competitive and that equal playing time (batting order and positions) are not guaranteed.
- ◆ Younger levels will have more rotations and opportunities in games than older levels. League games often provide more opportunities for rotations than tournaments.


- ◆ Registration through Crossbar
- ◆ There will be 1 Senior Legion team and 2 Junior Legion teams
- ◆ Teams are determined based on spring baseball performance and determined by Shakopee's high school's coaching staff
- ◆ Look for emails from Coach Schmitz for additional details
- ◆ If players are not placed on a legion team, they are invited to join the community league


- ◇ **Open:** to **ALL** players in 4th-12th grade
- ◇ **Age Level:** based on age as of May 1st,2026 or their grade during the 2025-2026 school year
 - ◇ 4th/5th Grade
 - ◇ 6/7th Grade
 - ◇ 8/9th Grade
 - ◇ 10-12th Grade
- ◇ **Practice:** 1-2x per week
- ◇ **League Games:** 10-12 played locally
- ◇ **Year End Tournament:** 1 weekend in July
- ◇ **Evaluations:** to determine skill levels and create equal teams on April 11th
- ◇ **League Dates:** April 27 – June 26 (pending fields opening by city)
- ◇ **Registration Fee:** \$250

Where: Drop Shot (1100 Shakopee Town Square, Shakopee)





SYBA OPEN GYM

- ◇ When: January – March
- ◇ Where: HS Field House or Middle School Gyms
- ◇ Cost: FREE for all players (gym fees covered by the SYBA)
- ◇ Schedule: Official schedule per age group can be found on the Shakopee Baseball Website
- ◇ Open gyms are led by volunteer coaches/parents/SYBA board members.
- ◇ Any parents planning on coaching this year are encouraged to attend all sessions for their player(s) age groups.
- ◇ PLEASE NOTE:
 - ◇ Open gym times are not facilitated practices. Parent chaperones are required at every session. Parent involvement/ support is highly encouraged.



Pre-Tryout Practices

- Optional indoor practice sessions in March will be offered for ages 9-14 before the regular tryouts
- Dates & Times to be shared after registration
- Session Goal: to work on the skills that will be evaluated during tryouts, so players are as successful as possible on the tryout dates

Interested Coaches: please attend your age specific sessions to help work with players / learn about who you may have an opportunity to choose to complete their rosters. (If selected to be a Head Coach).

REQUIRED TRAVELING TRYOUTS

9U-14U

- ◇ When: March 21nd & 22rd
- ◇ Where: MASH Facility, HS Field House, and West Middle School
- ◇ Cost: \$40 (non-refundable)
- ◇ Evaluators: High School Coaches
- ◇ Coordinating/Assisting: High School Players
(They do not have the ability to score a player)
- ◇ Evaluation:
 - ◇ Hitting
 - ◇ Throwing / Arm strength
 - ◇ Fielding (infield and outfield),
 - ◇ Speed.
 - ◇ Pitchers and catchers are evaluated separately.

Results will be posted on the Shakopee website shortly after try-out completion scores are shared with parents via email



REVAMPED TRAVELING TRYOUTS

9U-14U

We will have a revamped tryout process this year based on survey feedback.

Changes to Evaluation Process:

- ◆ Each team will have 8 locked picks across all age groups based on the tryout results (previously older age groups had 6-7 locked picks).
- ◆ Remaining coach's picks will be determined by the head coach with input from the Travel Directors and SYBA president.
- ◆ Factors considered for coaches picks: tryout results, 2025 season performance, winter practice attendance, team needs for pitchers/catchers, etc.
- ◆ A pitching machine has been added to the hitting portion of the tryout.
- ◆ Players will receive a practice round in each area before being evaluated.
- ◆ The full evaluated tryout will be at Mash to utilize the turf and open space.

TRYOUTS 9U-14U

Please keep in perspective . . . the big picture

The main goal of evaluations/tryouts is to place kids at a competitive level for this summer. This will not impact a player's baseball status in Shakopee for life! Rosters change every year.

It does not matter in high school where you played or how well you played in youth baseball. It will only matter how you perform in school and on the baseball field when you are in high school!

There are too many examples of how kids change over the years to predict high school success; there are examples (good and bad) **EVERY YEAR.**

It's often a better situation to be a top player on a lower team than a bottom player on a top team . . .

Improve each day, play hard, have fun – just be glad you're on a team and that you have the opportunity to play the great game of baseball this summer! That's the big picture.

Helmet: Red Helmets Required for all ages

Hats: We are putting player names on all hats this year to reduce lost, misplaced hats

You may also order an extra hat for your player as part of the registration for an additional charge

Baseball Cleats: 12U and under must wear plastic spikes, 13U and up must wear metal spikes

EQUIPMENT: BASEBALL BAT

Level	Max diameter at the thickest part of the bat	“Drop” (length minus weight)	Stamp
9U-11U	2 ¾ or less	Unlimited	USSSA or USA
12U & 13U	2 ¾ or less	-10	USSSA or USA
14U	2 ¾ or less	-5	USSSA or USA
14	2 ⅝ or less	-3	BBCOR (Omaha)
15U-18U	2 ⅝ or less	-3	BBCOR

- ◆ Players need to provide their own bat.
- ◆ For 9U to 13U, it is recommended to purchase a USSSA bat (more “pop”) vs. a USA bat
- ◆ If your player needs a new bat check our swap meet the day of tryouts!



EQUIPMENT: CATCHERS GEAR

- ◇ SYBA will provide one set of catcher's gear for each travel team, in house team, as well as all the community league teams
- ◇ You can purchase your own catcher's equipment if you prefer
- ◇ SYBA requires the catcher's equipment has the NOCSAE certification



TRAVELING REGISTRATION FEES



- ◆ Registration includes:
 - ◆ 2 Jerseys (9u-14u)
 - ◆ Hat w/name
 - ◆ Practice T-shirt
 - ◆ Game fees including city fee, league fees, tournaments, umpires
 - ◆ Non-refundable tryout Fee
 - ◆ Insurance
 - ◆ Baseballs and catcher's equipment
 - ◆ Comprehensive online background check for all coaches
- ◆ Registration does NOT include state tournament fees. Each team would be responsible for their entry in any state tournament; typically, around \$50 per state tourney per family
- ◆ Refund: If your player plays on a community league team instead of travel, you will be refunded the difference (less \$40 tryout fee)

COACHES ARE A VITAL PART OF OUR PROGRAM!

- ◇ 1 Head Coach
- ◇ 2-3 Assistant Coaches
- ◇ 1 Team Manager

- ◇ **Traveling Coaches:**
 - ◇ Have a strong knowledge of baseball skills and game management
 - ◇ Have a desire to improve the baseball skills of every player on the team
 - ◇ Ability to provide a fun atmosphere throughout the entire season
 - ◇ Good communicator with players and parents
 - ◇ Attend coaches' meetings and league scheduling meeting
 - ◇ Be a strong role model for both players and parents



Interested in Coaching?

Please answer 'Yes' with your intent online during registration of your son. You will select if interested in Head Coaching, Assistant Coaching, or both.

A formal application will follow.

****All coaches must complete the Trusted Coaches training and background check****

Head coaching applicants may be interviewed by a panel of Board members, as needed (especially if new to program)

Head coaches will be selected by the Board, based on:

- Prior coaching experience and parent surveys

- Interviews

- Application answers

- The level their player automatically qualified for

Once Head coaches are selected, they will select their staff of assistant coaches

FIELD MAINTENANCE

- ◇ After games and practices, players are expected to help coaches with field maintenance.
- ◇ The players should not leave until the team is finished cleaning up the field area and dugouts – leave the field better than when you arrived
- ◇ This is part of being on the team, especially once players begin on fields with more maintenance (clay mounds, tarps, dugouts, etc.).

SYBA partnered with The Shed Athletics for team training sessions!

- ◆ When: Three 90 Min sessions in April
- ◆ Where: The Shed in Jordan (16775 Greystone Lane)
- ◆ What to Expect:
 - ◆ 2 coaches from The Shed
 - ◆ Teams will have the cages to themselves each session
 - ◆ Teams will be split into 2 groups
 - ◆ Each group will complete 2 sessions
 - ◆ Hitting
 - ◆ Pitching/Throwing
- ◆ Benefit:
 - ◆ Live-at-bats against each other to simulate in-game experience before real games start
 - ◆ Use of The Shed Athletics equipment/technology (Rapsodos, radar guns, plyos, under/overload bats, etc.)³⁴



VOLUNTEERING (DIBS)

- ◆ Shakopee Tournament June 12-14
- ◆ Travel: 6 hours required per players family
- ◆ In House/ Community League: 2 hours required per players family (NEW)
- ◆ Max 12 for multi-player families
- ◆ Partial shifts are not allowed
- ◆ If your DIBS are not met, the credit card on file will be charged \$500 (Travel) \$250 (In-House/Community league)
- ◆ Email will be sent out to signup for volunteer shifts on www.shakopeeyouthbaseball.com
- ◆ Volunteering Credits:
 - ◆ Head Coach
 - ◆ 3 (Travel) & 2 (In-House/Community League)
 - ◆ Assistant Coaches, Team Manager, Grounds Crew
 - ◆ Head Coach has final selection of credits awarded


