## Pelham Pelicans

Game 1: Pelham Pelicans 8, Stars 6

In their first game together, the Stars showcased strong puck movement and teamwork, recording assists on four of six goals against an experienced Pelham program.

The passing game was led by Eli Vincent with two assists, while Jude Hunt and Leo Gyorfy each added a helper.

Goaltending: Wesley Sandstrom had a solid first outing of the season, stopping 17 of 25 shots.

A strong defensive effort was led by Jack Boardman and Jackson Adams.

## Union Thunder

Game 2: Union Thunder 7, Stars 6

Facing an established Union Thunder program, the Stars continued to build chemistry in just their second game together, with assists on four of six goals. Contributions from across the lineup and strong puck movement helped Baltimore battle through a tightly contested game that was ultimately decided in overtime.

Goaltending: In his first outing of the season between the pipes, Logan Scalice stopped 16 of 17 shots.

EJ May showed his versatility by shifting to defense and turning in a strong performance.

## Hunterdon Bears

Continuing to emphasize puck movement and teamwork, the Stars focused on point-to-point passing, low-to-high puck movement, and cross-slot passes throughout the game.

James Adams earned player of the game for his relentless forechecking and team play.

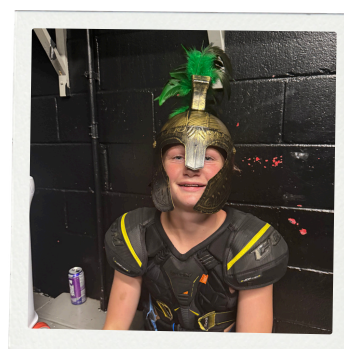


## CRANFORD HOCKEY CLUB
