THE QUICK VERSION

What it is: Serves on one of the association's committees (like Fundraising, Coaches, Disciplinary, or Marketing) to help further SLVYHA's goals.

Time commitment: Varies by committee and time of year, generally lighter than a chair/officer role.

When: Around the committee's work, meetings and project pushes.

Requirements:

Good for you if: You want a real say in how things run without leading, and prefer working as part of a group on a specific area.

Can you still watch your kid play? Yes, committee work is off-ice.

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- Contribute to your committee's work (varies by committee)
- Attend committee meetings and help on projects
- Report activities to the designated board member overseeing the committee
- Help further the association's purposes and goals

Committees may include:

- Coaches Committee
- Fundraising Committee
- Disciplinary Committee
- Marketing Committee

Committees are always evolving. Check with the board for the current committee list.

HOW TO DO IT

- Join a committee that fits your interest
- Committees are overseen by the Governing Board; the committee leader reports to a designated board member
- Contribute to the committee's specific projects and goals

WHAT'S PROVIDED VS. WHAT YOU BRING

Provided: The committee structure and board oversight.

You bring: Your time, ideas, and follow-through on the committee's work.

WHAT "DONE WELL" LOOKS LIKE

The committee makes real progress on its area, and you're a reliable contributor who helps move projects forward.

WHO TO ASK WHEN YOU'RE STUCK

Reports to / coordinates with: The committee leader and the designated board member overseeing that committee.

Questions about this role: The board.

INTERESTED IN A ROLE THAT'S ALREADY FILLED?

Don't wait for it to open up. Reach out to the person currently in the role, let them know you're interested and willing to help. Many hands make the work lighter, most role-holders are glad to share the load, bring on an assistant, or start showing someone the ropes for when the seat does open.

HOW TO SIGN UP

Members can express interest in committees at any time.

1. Express interest to the board or committee chair (contact the board)
2. Join a committee that fits
3. Start contributing

What happens after you sign up: The board member overseeing that committee will loop you in on current projects and when the committee meets.
