

LOCKER ROOM MONITOR

SLVYHA Volunteer Role · More Committed

THE QUICK VERSION

What it is: A screened adult who monitors the locker room before and after practices and games, keeping players safe and the space appropriate.

Time commitment: Per game/practice, typically the monitoring windows around ice time (generally about 60 minutes before games and 45 minutes before practice).

When: Before and after home practices and games, outside/at the locker room door.

Requirements: Yes, this is a screened role: - Background screening before being posted - SafeSport training (required for adults with regular player contact)

Good for you if: You want a meaningful safety role, are reliable, and can be present during the locker room window.

Can you still watch your kid play? Yes, the role is around the locker room window before and after ice, not during play.

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- Be posted directly outside the locker room during use, so only players, approved team personnel, and permitted family are present
 - Supervise conduct and keep the space appropriate and safe
 - Enforce the no-phones/no-recording rule in the locker room
 - Support the locker room policy
 - Leave doors open only where adequate privacy is still possible
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HOW TO DO IT

SLVYHA follows USA Hockey SafeSport locker room policy: - A screened monitor is posted outside the locker room during use - Only participants (coaches and players) and approved team personnel are allowed in - Cell phones and devices with recording capability are not permitted in the locker room - For mixed-gender teams, privacy arrangements are made so players change appropriately - Any one-on-one contact between an adult and a minor requires a second adult present

WHAT'S PROVIDED VS. WHAT YOU BRING

Provided: SafeSport training and the association's locker room policy to follow.

You bring: Your completed screening/training and reliable attendance.

WHAT "DONE WELL" LOOKS LIKE

The locker room stays safe, private, and appropriate. Only approved people are inside, phones stay away, and players are comfortable. No incidents.

WHO TO ASK WHEN YOU'RE STUCK

Reports to / coordinates with: Coaches and team manager; the SafeSport Coordinator is the contact for any concerns.

Questions about this role: The team manager and/or the Registrar.

HOW TO SIGN UP

Contact the team manager, or the Director of Operations if there is no team manager, and we'll get you started.

What happens after you sign up: We'll get you registered and trained, then scheduled with a team.
