Issues Resolved (even partially)

- 1. We were able to fill many of the goalie positions; there are still team levels that require shuffling to meet game needs.
- 2. We have a Parent Coordinator

Skills

In summary, key points included:

Positives

- Parents at the Mite level liked how skills offered many stations.

"For Next Time"

- Kids should do skills clinics with kids of the same skill level even at the cost of the schedule's consistency. The skill/age gaps were too wide in some instances where the lesser skilled players felt overwhelmed by their more advanced peers.
- The skills program was a positive experience at a high level.

Issues(Complaints)

- Coaches were frustrated at points that kids weren't paying attention.
- Some thought they needed more reps up and down their swimming lanes.
- How one skills session goes impacts whether or not kids go to the next one. If kids are standing around or if coaches are yelling at them, this can impact the attendance numbers.

Goalies

- Goalies who do skills should also have their own skills regiment besides protecting the goal.
- Goalie skills sessions on Sundays are going well; kids are showing up and learning.
