## Tournaments

Bucks Elite Hockey is a Travel Hockey program that competes against other travel hockey programs in Arizona and across the country. Each team typically competes in 2 local tournaments and 2 out-of-state tournaments within driving distance (eg, San Diego, Los Angeles, Las Vegas, New Mexico).

All tournament fees are included in the season's fees. Families are responsible for costs associated with travel such as transportation and lodging. Most tournaments are "stay to play," meaning the team must stay at a hotel that is approved by the tournament.

Below is a list of possible tournaments. This is not an exhaustive list and other opportunities may arise that are better suited for a particular team. Each team will join the tournaments that work best for that age division.

- **[Local]** Seeding Tournament (12U/14U) – Labor Day Weekend
- **[Local or Away]** Ice Breaker Invitational or other tournament – October
- **[Local or Away]** Thanksgiving Tournament – Thanksgiving Weekend 2026
- **[Local or Away]** Cactus Cup or Cal State Games – MLK Weekend 2027
- **[Away]** Presidents' Day Cup – Presidents' Day Weekend 2027
- **[Local]** AZ State Championships –March 2027

## Schedule & Ice Touches

Ice Touches: 2-3 times per week plus games

Some practice slots are shared ice, some are full ice, and all half and full ice practices are balanced between the teams. Practice times will be assigned in September (subject to change), and you will know the schedule for the whole season.

Players will have the opportunity to skate with their team weekly, as well as participate in power skating and skills sessions. Some practice slots may be converted to games to accommodate program schedules. Most games occur on Saturdays and Sundays. Teams may be assigned additional practices depending on the weekend game schedule. Current ice times are listed below, but are subject to change.

## Player Fees

Registration fee for 12U-16U: \$7,200

Includes:

- The total fee covers all costs for the season and includes everything listed in the "Program at a Glance" section as well as apparel
- There are no additional soft costs

Does not include:

- Costs associated with travel (gas, lodging, etc.)
- Team events/parties – typical cost \$20-30 per event, 2-3 times per season

The deposit upon signing your offer letter is \$850. We also offer payment options for the season, including monthly installments.

## Apparel Package

What's Included:

Player is responsible for:

- Standard hockey gear required to play – helmet, gloves, breezer, pads, stick, neck guard, mouth guard
- Black pants/slacks to wear with Bucks polo on game days

Players will come to the rink for gear fitting in June.

## Off-ice Training

Each Coach is responsible for dryland sessions with their team to build strength and agility. This season, the Bucks have renovated the on-site weight room and are looking forward to utilizing it for each team.

Another addition is we have invested in the platform Hudl, a video analysis program to facilitate game play analysis. Using Hudl the coaches will be able to analyze the team and each player's performance in games, then use the information to continue developing each player. Teams will conduct video review sessions at practices following games.

## Specialty Coaching

The Bucks have a dedicated goalie coach (to be announced).

We are also proud to continue our partnership with Crystal Roe, a well-known power skating coach in the Phoenix Valley.

## Fundraising & Events

Bucks Elite Hockey is a registered 501(c)(3) non-profit, and we engage in program-wide fundraising throughout the year as well as a few events in the season.
