



**Bogus Basin Sports Education Foundation  
Parent Code of Conduct**

Bogus Basin Sports Education Foundation (BBSEF) operates as a professionally managed youth sport organization. Clear standards, defined roles, and respectful communication are essential to maintaining a safe and structured training environment. Compliance with this Code is a condition of participation.

**Parent Expectations**

Parents are valued members of the BBSEF community. During designated program hours, coaches are responsible for athlete supervision, safety, and development. Coaching decisions regarding training structure, athlete progression, team placement, and competition strategy are final.

**Allow Coaches to Coach**

Parents will not provide technical instruction, tactical advice, or performance feedback during training or competition. Parents coaching from the side of a course, lift line, start area, finish area, or training venue is not permitted. Conflicting instruction interferes with athlete development and program integrity.

**Communication During Programming**

Training sessions and competitions require a coach's focus and active supervision. Parents may not confront or engage coaches regarding athlete matters during programming, enter restricted training areas, or interrupt a supervising coach.

Except in matters involving immediate safety, a 24-hour cooling-off period is required before initiating communication regarding concerns.

**Approved Communication Channels**

Routine questions or concerns should be directed respectfully via email to the athlete's Head Program Coach. If unresolved, concerns may be escalated to the Program Director and/or Executive Director.

Program-related communication must occur through official email channels. Facebook Messenger, Instagram, other social media platforms, and text messaging to personal phones (unless pre-authorized for logistics) are not approved communication methods. Verbal confrontations during training, competition, or team events are not permitted.

### **Course & Mountain Conduct**

Parents must remain outside designated training courses and controlled lanes, respect start and finish areas, comply with Bogus Basin policies, and avoid conduct that interferes with training operations or athlete safety. Disruptive or aggressive behavior is prohibited.

### **Respect for Community**

Parents will treat coaches, staff, volunteers, officials, athletes, and families with professionalism and courtesy. Harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or threatening behavior is prohibited.

### **SafeSport Alignment**

BBSEF follows policies consistent with U.S. Ski & Snowboard and U.S. Center for SafeSport standards. Parents agree to support all athlete safety, misconduct reporting, and anti-retaliation policies. Retaliation against any individual who reports a concern in good faith is strictly prohibited.

### **Social Media Conduct**

Parents are aware that they represent BBSEF and agree to use social media purposefully to promote positive things about the organization, teammates, coaches, staff, volunteers, opponents, and officials, among others. Parents agree not to pursue grievances online; concerns should be addressed through official BBSEF channels with the BBSEF executive staff.

### **Enforcement**

Noncompliance may result in disciplinary action, including a warning, required meeting, restricted venue access, removal from travel or competition, suspension, or dismissal from BBSEF. In matters involving safety, harassment, or SafeSport concerns, BBSEF may immediately restrict program or venue access pending review. BBSEF retains sole discretion in determining appropriate action.
