RAYHA Board Meeting

Welcome (6:00PM)

Meeting Minutes (6:01PM)

- August meeting minutes were sent out but have not been approved yet because website dates need to be finalized.
- July meeting minutes were approved and posted to the website.

Motion Updates (6:02PM)

- The board voted to end registration on August 23rd and to charge a \$150 late registration fee and cancel warm-ups for anyone registering late.
- After the vote, 3 people registered late. The board decided to waive the fees and allow everyone to participate in warm-ups.

Gambling Business (6:02PM)

- The gambling report was passed around.
- Last month's check was for \$43,000, the best month so far this year.
- This amount includes 3 payrolls (first half of CEO payroll, and 2 insurance payments).
- Last year in September, the profit was \$59,000, but the first half of the CEO payroll came out much earlier last year.
- The accountant was surprised by how high the charitable gambling profits were, as most other charitable gambling organizations were down last month.
- Minimum wage is increasing at the beginning of next year, which will affect the hourly wage of all sellers.
- The current minimum wage for sellers varies between \$11.00 and \$14.50.
- The new minimum wage is \$11.18. The board will need to discuss and vote on how much to increase the seller's hourly wage.
- Midway Skating wants RAYHA to investigate spending more money at the bingo hall, specifically to upgrade security cameras.
- The security camera system is old and has some blind spots.
- Some cameras are out, and it's not worth it to replace them with ancient matching cameras.
- Midway would like RAYHA to get the outside cameras working again.
- The board needs to look into the actual cost of upgrading the cameras.
- RAYHA is required to maintain a balance of \$35,000 in case of a large expenditure.

- The board will also need to look into upgrading the bathrooms at some point in the future, but that is a much larger project.
- The bingo hall is switching up the bales at Lucky's.
- The bingo hall was asked to start later than usual due to college football viewing.

Year to date, RAYHA has received \$62,500 in donations.

Bylaw Updates

- Candace released the updated bylaws for the board to review.
- The bylaws have been updated to replace the word "president" with "board of directors" or "CEO."
- Some flexibility has been added to the bylaws to allow for a future president.
- Some clarity has been added to the bylaws on association membership.
- Some COVID-related items have been removed from the bylaws.
- Committees have been added to the end of the bylaws.
- The fiduciary responsibility section has been kept very high level.

- Minnesota Hockey has a slide deck on fiduciary responsibility that the board can review annually.
- Phill noted that the auditors often comment that RAYHA is a volunteer board and does
 not have a committee that deals with finances. He encourages other board members to
 challenge him and Jens on the finances to ensure accuracy.
- Candace plans to send the fiduciary responsibility slides to the voting council for review.
- The board may go into more specifics on fiduciary responsibility in next year's bylaws.

New Business (6:18PM)

Roseville Arena Speaker Realignment

- Justin Brown confirmed that all user groups (youth hockey, girls' high school, boys' high school, and figure skating) will contribute to the cost of repositioning the speakers in Roseville Arena.
- The total cost to reposition the speakers is \$4,685.
- RAYHA's portion of the cost is \$1,171.25.
- The speakers in Roseville Arena are being repositioned because they are hard to hear.
- The sound system in Roseville Arena is the same as the one in the other arena, which has good sound.
- Kevin is confident that repositioning the speakers will solve the sound issues.

Bantam AA Assistant Coach

- Ryan is the head coach for Bantam AA.
- Ryan requested approval for Justin Gale to be an assistant coach for Bantam AA.
- Justin Gale was on staff last year, is a non-parent, and is considered a huge asset to the team.
- This will be a paid position for \$1,500.
- Justin Gale has been skating with RAYHA for 11 years.
- He was injured seven years ago but still attended every practice and game.
- He has been a part of the program for the past year.

- Phill requested an updated roster with all the payments for coaches.
- The only paid coaches on the boys' side are for Bantam AA, Bantam B1, and Bantam B2.
- The board needs to discuss the Bantam C coaching situation.
- The budget for paid coaches is \$4,500 for the head coach and \$1,500 for each assistant coach.
- The total budget for paid coaches is over \$50,000.

Bantam C Coaching Vacancy

- Chad Olander is the head coach for Bantam C.
- There are currently no parent volunteers to be assistant coaches for Bantam C.
- Three people said they would help, and four people said maybe they would help.
- The board is concerned that they will not be able to have a Bantam C team if a parent does not step up to be an assistant coach.
- Chelsey has scheduled a skills coach to be at the first Bantam C practice.
- Dave will reach out to John O to see if he is interested in coaching Bantam C.
 John has been coaching with RAYHA for seven years.
- Dave will reach out to Pat K, a coach from Blaine who had previously expressed interest in coaching Peewee B1, to see if he has any interest in coaching Bantam C.
- The board discussed posting about the Bantam C coaching vacancy on social media.

Squirt A Assistant Coach

- Justin had three coaches quit, including two assistant coaches.
- Justin asked two other people to be assistant coaches, but they declined.
- Justin is requesting approval for a paid assistant coach at the Squirt A level.
- The pay for a Squirt A assistant coach is \$1,500.
- Justin is recommending Hannah Vitale for the position. Hannah is a non-parent coach.
- Jess questioned whether there were any parents who could volunteer as assistant coaches.
- Justin stated that there are no parents who can skate.
- Jess is concerned that the Squirt C level is often overlooked and that the A and B level coaches have more experience.
- Justin stated that he will offer Hannah Vitale the Bantam C head coaching position for \$3,000 if she would prefer that.

• Justin stated that he will reach out to the association for volunteers once the Squirt A team is made, and if a qualified assistant coach steps up, he will pull Hannah Vitale's name for the paid assistant coach position.

Tryouts (6:43PM)

General Tryout Information

- Tryouts begin on Sunday, September 22nd.
- There will be two goalie tryout sessions on Sunday afternoon.
- The goalie tryout sessions will be split into two hours.
- New tryout jerseys and socks arrived. The socks will also be the practice socks for the year.
- RAYHA will be using a new tryout system this year called SkillShark.
- SkillShark is similar to Team Genius but is one-third of the cost and more versatile.
- SkillShark allows RAYHA to record the tryouts and provide feedback to players.
- There will be five evaluators at tryouts this year, including one head coach at each level.
- The evaluators will follow the levels throughout the tryouts.
- There will be two on-ice hours each day of tryouts, and then one hour in the tryout room for discussion.
- The tryout committee will meet in the Fireside Room for the duration of tryouts.
- Justin will reach out to Mite families to help with check-in and locker room assignments.
- Only people affiliated with the tryout committee or evaluations will be allowed on the second level of the rink or in the Fireside Room.
- Tryouts have been shortened this year.
- All players will skate three sessions.
- Players will scrimmage each other.
- The number of skaters at each session has been adjusted so that there will be roughly 22 skaters at the third and final skates.
- Scores will be aggregated throughout the tryouts.
- In the past, scores were reset after two days of tryouts.
- Justin will ask board members and other volunteers to help with check-in if needed.
- Brian asked if the girls' side could use SkillShark.

- Justin stated that SkillShark has a \$5 per player option and a \$10 per player option.
- Justin stated that he does not see why the girls' side could not use SkillShark.
- SkillShark allows for different levels of feedback to be given to players.

Injury Protocol

- The board discussed how to handle injuries during tryouts.
- In the past, injured players would skate by themselves and be evaluated based on their team placement from the previous year.
- The board discussed whether coaches should be able to overrule the placement of injured players.
- The board discussed whether it is better to petition the coach or the board for placement of injured players.
- The board discussed how other associations handle injuries during tryouts.
- The board discussed whether it would be helpful for the tryout committee to have information from the previous year's coaches on injured players.
- The board decided that injured players will come to the tryouts after the second session to meet with the tryout committee and the coach.
- Justin will reach out to the injured player's coach from last year to get feedback.
- The tryout committee and the coach for the injured player's level will hear the player's case and make a decision on placement.
- The injury protocol will be added to the tryout procedures on the website.

General Board Updates (7:09PM-7:28PM)

Operations Updates - Justin Brown

- All RAYHA teams will play in District 2 this year.
- Player fees will be increasing by \$3 this year because RAYHA is now responsible for 75% of the ice sheets.
- Next year, player fees will increase again by \$3 because RAYHA will be responsible for 100% of the ice sheets.
- Players ages 12 and up must wear a tethered mouthguard, including goalies.
- District 2 is enforcing the tethered mouthguard rule.
- The board discussed the need to communicate the tethered mouthguard rule to all families.
- Coaches should remind players about the tethered mouthguard rule.
- Players who do not have a tethered mouthguard will be kicked off the ice.

Boys Hockey Updates - Chelsey Rosenthal

Chelsey Rosenthal was not present at the meeting.

Girls Hockey Updates - Brian Borgestad

- Warm-up ice is going well.
- RAYHA hired a skills coach from the NHL to help with warm-ups.
- All RAYHA girls teams will play in District 2 this year, except for the 10U A team.
- Tryouts for the 10U and 12U girls teams begin on Friday, September 27th.
- Goalie tryouts will be held the night before, on Thursday, September 26th.
- The number of tryout sessions and layers has been reduced this year.
- There will be three tryout sessions: one skills session and two scrimmage sessions.
- The 15U girls team will be on the ice four times a week in October.
- Tryouts for the 15U girls team will begin on November 1st, after high school tryouts.
- Game jerseys for the girls teams were ordered.
- Brian B is currently placing evaluators for on-ice and off-ice evaluations.
- The girls hockey program is on track with its paid coaching budget of \$6,000.
- The 10U B2 team has 13 players, the B1 team has 9 players, and the B team has 6 players.
- The 12U A team has 5 players, the B1 team has 8 players, and the B2 team has 5 players.
- Saint Paul is not fielding a 12U team this year.

Secretary Updates - Jake Remitz

- All outstanding balances from last season have been collected.
- There are still some outstanding financial aid applications, but everyone is registered.
- Financial aid determinations will be made before tryouts are complete.
- There have been some registration cancellations and team shuffling due to players being outside of boundaries and other reasons.
- There has been some confusion and shuffling of teams in the Mite program.
- Candace is still waiting on releases for 11 players, including two boys, two girls, and seven Mites.
- Candace has tried to avoid having parents contact Kevin for releases.
- Brian B asked Jake Remitz if he could shut off registration.
- Jake Remitz stated that he can hide the registration link on the website but will still be able to edit registrations and upgrade players to the unlimited season pass.
- We received a grant from the state of Minnesota for financial aid.
- Jeff has some starter gear and goalie gear available for families who need it.
