

Youth Sports Concessions Policy

1. Product Guidelines

- **Prepackaged Items Only:**
 - All food and beverage items sold must be prepackaged and individually sealed by the manufacturer.
 - No homemade or on-site prepared food is permitted (e.g., grilled, baked, or assembled items).
 - Examples of approved items include:
 - Chips, pretzels, granola bars
 - Candy (sealed packages only)
 - Bottled water, soda, and sports drinks - See below for specifics
 - Packaged nuts or trail mix
 - **Hot Food Restrictions:**
 - **No hot food may be served or sold (e.g., pizza, hot dogs, nachos, heated items) unless it is supplied and provided directly by CAS (Campus Auxiliary Services).** Contact catering@geneseo.edu to inquire about placing a hot food order.
 - Concession operators may not prepare, heat, or source hot food independently.
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2. Beverage Standards

- **Coca-Cola Products Preferred:**
 - In alignment with the Campus Auxiliary Services Coke contract, Coca-Cola brand products should be used and sold whenever possible.
 - Substitutions may only be made when Coca-Cola products are unavailable.
 - Examples include: Coca-Cola, Diet Coke, Sprite, Dasani water, Powerade, Minute Maid juice, etc.
 - **Hot Beverages:**
 - **Only CAS (Campus Auxiliary Services) may provide hot beverages** at youth sporting events. Contact catering@geneseo.edu to place a hot beverage order.
 - Concession operators are not permitted to produce or serve hot beverages independently.
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3. Food Safety & Handling

- All concession volunteers must ensure:
 - Items are stored off the ground and kept clean, dry, and protected from contamination.
 - Beverages are kept in coolers with ice or refrigeration as needed.
 - Gloves are worn when handling unsealed items (e.g., ice, cups, napkins).
 - Expired or damaged packages may not be sold.
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4. Setup & Operations

- Concession areas should remain clean, organized, and attended at all times during operation.
 - Trash and recycling receptacles must be available and emptied regularly.
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5. Credit Card Processing

- If a concession chooses to accept credit or debit card payments, it does so **at its own discretion and risk**.
 - Campus Auxiliary Services **does not provide, assume responsibility for, or hold liability** related to the use of third-party credit card processing systems.
 - Operators are solely responsible for maintaining secure and compliant processing methods.
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6. Compliance

Failure to adhere to this policy may result in suspension of concession privileges or additional oversight by campus administration.
