Survey Feedback



- **Protect the program's core strength – coaching**
 - Coaching quality is the biggest driver of satisfaction and development; retain, recognize, and share best practices (goal-setting, accountability, inclusive development) across teams.
- **Make off-ice culture a visible priority**
 - Publish clear locker room expectations, implement consistent supervision/monitoring, and ensure swift, transparent follow-through on bullying/teasing concerns.
- **Set and enforce parent conduct standards**
 - Reinforce spectator expectations and consequences to reduce heckling and hostility, especially when teams play each other.
- **Improve practice quality within constraints**
 - Where possible, reduce overcrowded ice, increase full-ice reps, and provide coaches with tools for more practice variety and more individual feedback checkpoints.
- **Strengthen leadership and accountability structures for players**
 - Consider captains/alternates or another leadership model and explicitly teach leadership, respect, and representation of the organization.
- **Address girls program equity and advocacy**
 - Ensure consistent changing space for girls and proactively engage/communicate on CAHA/state tournament parity and planning (avoid last-minute scrambles).
- **Optimize travel and tournament choices**
 - Reassess high-cost/low-game events (notably Salt Lake City), prioritize better-bracketed and more time-efficient tournaments, and communicate tradeoffs early.

Season Reconciliation & Financials



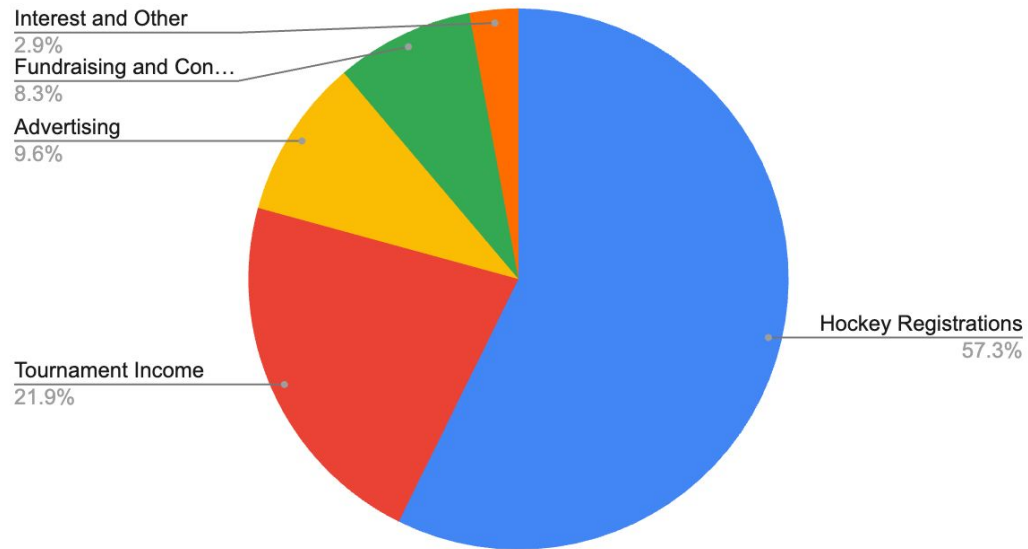
- Financial aid was provided to 16 players this year.
- We are now able to draw 4.5% annually from our endowment, with those funds being allocated to additional coach compensation.
- We are ending the fiscal year in strong financial position, with one month remaining, thanks in part to diversified revenue streams, including registration, CD interest income, and advertising revenue.



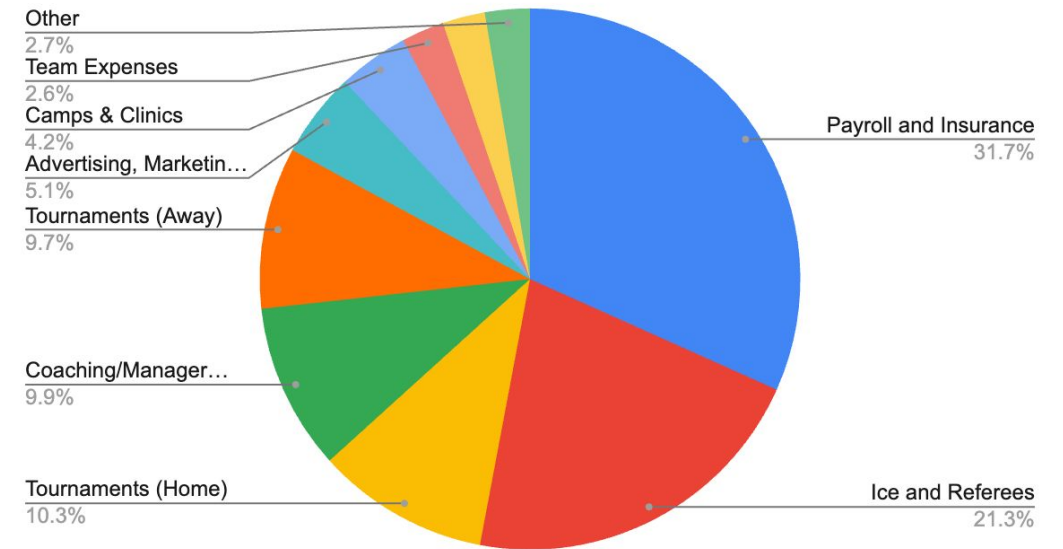
Financial Breakdown

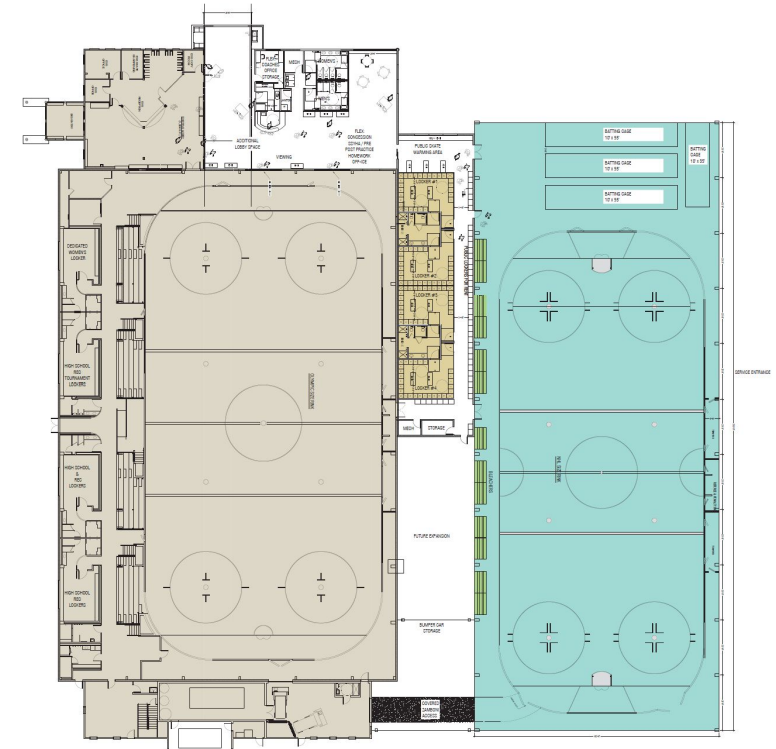
- United Way of the Yampa Valley Holiday Food Card Program
