2025–26 Season Financial Summary

A season-end update for our skating families, sponsors and community

Steamboat Skating Club wrapped up another full season on the ice, and we're grateful for the chance to share a high-level look at how the club's finances came together between July 2025 and June 2026. Our programs, events and fundraisers depend entirely on the support of our skating families, coaches, sponsors, donors and volunteers, and this past season was no exception.

Revenue

The club brought in just over \$204,000 this season. The majority came from season registrations, lessons and our summer programs, which form the backbone of everything we offer skaters year-round. The rest came from a healthy mix of community support: our fundraising events, the annual Ice Show, sponsorships from local businesses, and the Run Rabbit Run race, along with generous donations throughout the year.

Expenses

Total expenses for the season came in around \$197,000. As in most years, the largest share of that went directly toward coaching and ice time — the two costs most closely tied to skater development and time on the ice. The remainder covered producing our events and shows, day-to-day club operations, scholarships for skaters in need, and the administrative costs of running a nonprofit club.

Bottom Line

The club closed the season with a modest surplus of roughly \$8,000. Consistent with our mission as a nonprofit, this surplus is reinvested directly into the club — supporting scholarships, program quality and next season's activities, rather than sitting idle.

Thank you to every skater, family, coach, sponsor and volunteer who made this season possible. We look forward to another great year on the ice together.
