State and local demand for user groups utilizing current facility has outgrown the current capacity.





DESIGN CONCEPT

- 50,000 sq. ft. building added to the westside of the existing Casper Ice Arena
- Additional second sheet of ice
- Increased spectator seating
- Four skybox suites
- Dedicated junior, high school, and figure skating locker rooms
- Four additional locker rooms
- Two team meeting rooms
- Relocated concessions area to serve both rinks and portable consession kiosk stations to be used throughout the building
- Single entrance and lobby to access both rinks with drop-off loop for players and spectators
- · Referee and medical rooms
- Dryland training area

CREATING ECONOMIC IMPACT

Historically, Casper tends to be a state and regional hub for business and sports. With the addition of a second sheet, the Casper Ice Arena will become the only facility in a 200-mile radius with two sheets of ice under one roof. This will have a large economic impact in the Casper community.

Having grown by 20 percent in the last two years, youth sports tourism is the fastest growing segment in the travel industry. As more kids get involved in travel sports and attend camps and tournaments across the nation, families are increasingly coordinating vacations with children's sporting events. A regional facility like this will draw families into the Casper area, increasing tourism revenue for the community.

Building a second sheet of ice and expanding opportunities for youth sports in Casper helps the long-term health of our children and economic sustainability of our community.

DECREASE MUNICIPAL SUBSIDIES

In addition to the potential economic and sports tourism growth in our community, increased opportunity for participation and large tournaments and

events will drastically decrease the City of Casper subsidies needed to run the arena each year. The second sheet will create a new revenue stream for the City of Casper without significantly increasing operating costs.

PUT CASPER ON ICE 2.0

Youth sports have grown into a multi-billion dollar industry and research has proven communities thrive when they promote policies and develop infrastructure that encourages sport and recreation activity.

With your help, Casper Ice Arena can become the premier ice facility not only in Wyoming, but in the region. A second sheet of ice provides opportunity to host Colorado Avalanche affiliate games, host all awarded divisional state tournaments (up to 50+ out of town teams), host regional and national figure skating competitions, host Team Wyoming and other travel team practices, and host large hockey camps in the off-season. These opportunities engage more young athletes at every level of play.

Mountains of evidence now document the physical, mental, social, emotional, cognitive and academic benefits that flow to youth whose bodies are in motion. By adding a second sheet of ice, Casper will have the ability to serve more young

athletes — from the elite travel player with pro aspirations to the late bloomers still developing and the casual athlete looking to have fun while being active. This opens the door to everyone to play and will offer a better pathway in sports for our community's youth.

For these programs, leagues and clubs to flourish, Casper needs more ice. Help us once again Put Casper On Ice and support our campaign to build a second sheet.
