Hockey Committee

- Schedules
 - Now thru November 1; it's still evolving
 - Please squelch expectations whenever you can because it's always moving
 - We are on top of it as much as we can possibly be
 - There will be times when every team only sees the ice once, Monday-Thursday
 - It's happening to everyone other than Bantams (because they go on so late)
- Mite placements
 - We placed 67 kids
 - We had two issues. One we know about; one we are still dealing with
 - In order to make Mondays' and Thursdays' mayhem work, we only took two blue teams
- Mini/Mighty Mites
 - Pete: starts this weekend
 - First two weeks, they will run at same time, together
 - On week 3, Mini Mites will start at normal time, Mighty Mites will come out 30 minutes later and stay for hour
 - Mighty: 3 kids per station; one coach per station
 - Mighty: will start some cross-ice games
 - Mighty: Pete will run Mighty Mites
 - For Mini: we'll help Ken and Pete with practice plans
 - With Ken, we asked him "what do you want to do, and let us draw it up for you."
 - The plans are for the people helping him.
 - Mini and Mighty: 60 total; probably 15-20 Mighties
 - Mini Mites is not a race to get to Mites. It's a place to develop and grow; there's nothing
 wrong with being there for a couple years.

- Coaching
 - We've had two meetings
 - Everything is done except for Blue; will figure Blue out soon
 - Scharf and Holzinger are handling it for now, as they have children
- Teams/CSHL
 - PeeWees are too light; we may move some Squirts up
 - CSHL scheduling meeting is on 10/29
 - Brad needs blackout dates and ice slot schedule by 10/14
 - Come early November, ice schedule will be done for the whole year
- Mouth pieces and neck guards
 - Last year, the Board voted to make neck guards mandatory for every child in the program.
 - It's a Parma rule; neck guards are part of the uniform.
 - Mouth pieces are recommended
 - USA Hockey and CSHL require mouth guards for PeeWee and up; we recommend
 - Brad: Next summer would like to re-discuss mouth guard rule for PHA

President's Report:

- Budget
 - Still working on it; will send out as soon as possible

 - Monday, 11/14 and Tuesday, 11/15
 - Scheduled before practices
 - Mini Mites will come in early on 11/15
 - Using same company as last year
- All-Association tournament in Niagara
 - We will get hotel assignments next week
