

Throughout the summer many of our hockey players participated in Hockey Camps throughout the state and even out of state. Hockey camps can be a great way to grow as a player and keep your skills sharp before the next season starts.



A few of our players shared a little bit about their experiences. Bayln Rhone, Peewee, participated in two camps this season. He worked on his skating skills during a Planet Hockey camp that was hosted at DU in Denver then he worked on his goalie skills at Hull Camp in Littleton. Bayln said he loved both camps and even enjoyed the dryland training that happened during the Planet Hockey camp. His parents

thought both experiences were fantastic and would recommend both camps.

Brady Acker, Mites, also participated in two camps this season. He went to one camp at DU and then Summit Camp as well. Both were 5 days. As a Mite, Brady, loved the Summit Camp because the coaches were very attentive and made sure all the kids were doing what they were supposed to. He said that although the DU camp was fun, he wouldn't want to do it again next year.



Kendall Glancey, Bantam, went out of state to Shattuck-St. Marys which is a private school south of Minneapolis, MN for a girls camp. 
FRASER VALLEY HOCKEY ASSOCIATION'S MISSION:


