Appendix III: D3 meeting notes

- EBUG rules relaxed to help teams that didn't have a goalie. Must not be used to try to improve your team. Should try to find the EBUG within association first, then district, then outside. Rest rules for a practice can be relaxed if the EBUGs parents and coach approved (ie a 6pm practice, and then a 8pm EBUG game)
- Additional conversation about impact of mite waiver rules will be happening to see the impact on associations
- Parents reaching out to D3 regarding team placement are being redirected back to the associations. No place for D3 to be fielding these. No indication that this was from HYHA parents.
- Safesport issue awareness
- Make sure all tournaments are registered with MNH and D3 ASAP if not done yet. OMG, Mpls and Delano have uploaded all theirs.
- D10 is doing a trial of a tourney for squirts with intermediate nets which won't count against 35 game limits. This is a trial as there are conversations about moving to intermediate nets for squirts.
- D3 still needs to fill the critical role of Membership & Development Rep. Pass along to folks in the association. This group/role provides some political clout for things in the larger MN Hockey community including Wild Events.
