When Do I Start? What's the process?

- Recruiting events start as early as the summer going into your freshman season, coaches will notice you at showcases/tourneys.
 - College coaches have windows they are allowed to speak to you. Each division has specific dead periods. They can begin talking to you
 September 1st of your Junior Year.
 - You can verbally Commit to a school the start of your Junior year of High School
 - You can sign your letter of intent to that school the start of your senior year

Easing into recruiting

- We typically start to send our players who are incoming freshman and sophomores to high level recruiting tournaments to really get a good look at what these tournaments and processes actually look like.
- Kids get the feel of better competition and environment
- Take advantage of camps and showcases at these tournaments
- Be active in the process, ask your coaches questions
- Getting your name in front of coaches at a young age can help you when september 1st of your junior year comes around



Creating a Recruiting Tape

- First you should start out with any highlights if possible if not it's perfectly okay!
- Keep the highlight tape between 2-3 minutes
- If you want music do an instrumental (no lyrics)
- Upload to youtube, hudl and IMCLA if you have one
- If you don't know how to create one, reach out to Coach Cabe he can make one for you if you send him the right info and film.
- Include your information
 - Cumulative School GPA
 - Academic Awards
 - Athletic Honors
 - List position (Attack) (Attack/ Midfielder) (Defense/LSM) (LSM)
 - Cumulative and latest season lacrosse Stats based on position (Goals, Assists, Ground balls, Forced Turnovers, Save %)
 - Contact information (Yours, HS Coach and Club Coach)

Do your Research

 There are hundreds of colleges at all levels from NCAA D2, D3, NAIA, MCLA and more.

- Research things about the school
 - What GPA is required
 - Around Campus activities
 - Scholarships
 - Campus Life
 - Facilities
 - Professors
 - Academics
 - Location
 - etc.

All of these things listed above are huge parts of choosing a college so make sure your doing your research and can find somewhere where you'll be comfortable playing and getting things done in the classroom.



Reaching out and Visits

- Coaches get emails, highlight tapes, phone calls, you name it. Make yourself stand out with a unique email.
- It is important to know what the coach at the school you are reaching out to is looking for.
- First, GPA is the most crucial part. A coach wants to make sure you can attend their school prior to spending time on recruiting you.
- If all goes well and both parties are interested try to set up a visit with the coach or attend a prospect camp of theirs
- A school visit goes a long way. It shows you are willing to sacrifice your time for your future.





Getting their attention

Make yourself standout!

- Start off with your name
- Tell them where you are from
- Talk about your education (Grades/ Honor
- Speak of your interest in the school
- Mention your athletic accolades
- Mention your stats
- Keep it short and to the point
- Have genuine interest in visiting
- Be unique!
