





## **LOCKER ROOM MONITORS (2025-2026)**

- 1. For Squirt Level and above, each Team must designate at least 2 volunteer locker room monitors. The locker room monitors must be approved by the Head Coach. Names and contact information (email and phone number) must be shared with the Team Manager. The Team Manager will provide names and contact information to Celia Luett via a Google Form.
- 2. Locker room monitors must register as volunteers with USA Hockey and must be Safesport trained.
- 3. At least 1 locker room monitor or a coach must be present for <u>any</u> on-ice activity for their team. It is expected that the locker room monitor will arrive 45 minutes before the start of any on-ice activity and stay for up to 20-30 minutes after any on-ice activity, unless times are modified by the Head Coach.
  - Locker room monitors do not need to be inside of the locker room for the entire time. It is sufficient to be immediately outside the locker room and check-in periodically. If a coach is present, the parent volunteer locker room monitor can be relieved of duties.
- 4. The Team Manager must keep a weekly schedule of who is monitoring the locker room. This schedule must be made available to the applicable Hockey Director of the Board of Directors of Glenview Stars Hockey upon request.
- 5. No player is allowed in the locker room until the locker room monitor or coach is present, along with at least 1 other player.
- 6. Locker room monitors are responsible for reporting any behavior/conduct incidents in the locker room to the Head Coach immediately, with a follow-up email to the applicable hockey director.

- 7. The team slush amount for locker room monitors should be reduced by the amount a locker room monitor pays as the fee for the background check required by USA Hockey.
- 8. For Squirt and above, <u>ONLY</u> Safesport trained individuals are allowed in the locker room.
