Reality of the Situation:

Have cut extra spend, invested back into association, and facing expense increases

Examples:


- 24% increase in ice costs since 2023 (Increase of \$148 per player avg. \$795/player ice cost per year)
- 82% increase in association-paid hockey development since 2023
- Higher quality jerseys (~1.5x increase in cost)
- Mite Goalie Gear (~\$35k in 2024/25 & this year)
- Many other increases as well (D6 fees, tournament costs)
- Fundraising activities are important!
- Implemented 6% Core Fees increase for 2025/26 season
 - Last increase was 2022-2023 season
 - AA and A players will be assessed additional fee after team selection
 - \$250 for AA, \$150 for A
 - Additional ice time, increased D6 fees; paid non-parent coaches; higher tournament entry fees; etc.
 - CCHA does reserve the right to assess teams at EOY if necessary

UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS



- Official Uniform Colors
- **BLACK** Helmet, Gloves, Pants/Shell







- Applies to all "Upper" level players
 - Squirt/10U, Peewee/12U, Bantam/15U
- NOT Applicable to goalie helmets, pads and gloves



VOLUNTEER HOURS



- Volunteer Coordinator

- Upper Level Volunteer Requirements
 - 12 hours per player, Family Max of 20 Hours
- Mandatory Volunteer Deposit
 - \$750 per player / \$1,500 per family (2+ players)
 - Buy-out option (\$750 / player or \$1,500 per family)
- DIBS no shows will be penalized at \$125.00 per hour

CONCESSIONS



Stormhawk Service Nights

- Teams will be assigned a High school hockey game concession stand shift to work.
- As a team you will run the concessions and take care of the rink for the evening.
- This does not count towards your volunteer hours. This is a required team service project, and the intent is to bond and support our high school hockey program while also giving the kids ownership of their rinks.
- You will get instructions and guidance for your night. You will need to divide the kids and 1-3 parents, ¾ will work the window and handle the food area. The other kids can walk around and pick up trash and police the game areas for trash, they can trade halfway through or however you as a team decide to structure this.
- If your team CANNOT do the game you are scheduled, it is then your team's responsibility to trade with another team. Our Ice coordinator will do the best they can when assigning these games.

LOCKER ROOM MONITORS



USA Hockey SafeSport Locker Room Policy Requirements:

"All Member Programs shall publish locker room policies to the parents of all Minor Athletes that are specific to the Facilities they regularly use. The Member Program's policies shall include the program's (a) practices for supervising and monitoring locker rooms and changing areas; (b) permission or lack of permission for parents to be in the locker rooms; (c) prohibited conduct, including at least all forms of abuse and misconduct prohibited by USA Hockey; and (d) specific policies regarding the use of mobile electronic devices and phones and prohibiting the use of a device's recording capabilities. A sample locker room policy form may be found at usahockey.com/safesportprogram.

For each team, the coach and/or team administrators shall be responsible for compliance with the locker room supervision requirements of this Policy. A coach and/or team administrator that fails to take appropriate steps to ensure the Locker Room Policy is adhered to, and any USA Hockey Participant or parent of a Minor Athlete who otherwise violates this Policy is subject to appropriate disciplinary action; moreover, an Affiliate may impose fines or other sanctions against any Member Program whose teams do not comply with this Locker Room Policy."

Please note: Sample policies, quick reference guides, and other documents from USA Hockey are tools to help Associations build a suitable locker room policy, but it is up to the Association to establish their own Policy.



LOCKER ROOM MONITORS



Key Updates to CCHA Locker Room Policy:

- Clarification that Coaches can serve as locker room monitors Previously only parents.
- Establish clear roles of coaches, team managers, and parent locker room monitors
- Communicate Parent Requirements to comply with USA Hockey SafeSport
- Read the new policy: Chaska Chanhassen Hockey Association | CCHA Policies

• Key Requirements / Rules:

- Coaches CAN be Locker Room Monitors
- At least one locker room monitor must be present for all games, practices, and scrimmages
- Locker room monitors must comply with USA Hockey SafeSport Training & Background checks

Parents: It is your responsibility to find a replacement for your locker room monitor shift if you are unable to cover it.

What this means for you:

- Girls Levels Mom's will likely cover locker room monitoring duties Get your requirements done!
- Coaches will determine whether parents or coaches will serve as Locker Room Monitors for their teams
- Parents:
 - Register with CCHA Team Volunteer Registration (requires USA Hockey Number)
 - Complete USA Hockey SafeSport Training
 - Complete Background Check
 - Follow detailed instructions found on CCHA Website: Chaska Chanhassen Hockey Association | TEAM VOLUNTEER OVERVIEW



CCHA BRANDING REMINDER



- Subject to Federal Trademark registration applications.
- No person is authorized to have anything made bearing these marks without a license from the CCHA Board.
- Do not ask a vendor to do this for you or your team for any merchandise.



CODE OF CONDUCT



Code of Conduct forms are required for all coaches, parents, & players.

Note: All Code of Conduct forms are captured in the registration process.

- Remember that playing hockey in the CCHA is a privilege, not a right!
- Referees reserve the right to remove parents from games for misconduct.
- The "24 Hour Rule" is strictly enforced for any complaints.
- Violations by a player may result in probation, suspension or CCHA membership refusal per Article 6 of MN Hockey Bylaws.
- Violations may be enforced by head coach, team manager, level commissioners or CCHA Board of Directors.



TEAM SLUSH FUNDS



Slush funds are intended for covering miscellaneous variable team expenses and enhance team experience during the season.

- Per CCHA rules, slush funds are capped at \$250 per player unless otherwise approved by the CCHA board.
- **Team Treasurer** is responsible for maintaining fund and reporting expenditures / budget to all families on team. (No Venmo to Manage)
- All families on team have equal vote on setting slush fund amount and all expenditures for the season.
- CCHA Board reserves the right to intervene if team slush fund requirements are deemed to be "excessive".
 - While all families are expected to participate in funding team slush funds, please be cognizant that not all families are in the same financial position. Fund amounts should be reasonable.



- Order Process and Expectations
 - The CCHA took a hybrid approach in order to get as many jerseys into production prior to September, so that we can avoid the backlog at the manufacturing facilities.
 - Asking at registration for top 3 jersey choices for the boys side and on the girls side, using the crossbar registration to block off already taken numbers.
 - Based on the numbers in the association, it requires a quicker process to get jerseys and socks in to production
 - 370 between the boys upper Levels
 - 115 between the girls upper Levels
 - 292 between the boys and girls lower levels
 - Round 1 of Jerseys Orders for Upper Levels has take Place
 - Criteria (1) Lone Soldier #, then (2) Date of Registration
 - Using top 3 jersey number choice
 - Upper girls: registration jersey number and/or subsequent top 3 jersey number choice
 - Round 2 of Jerseys Orders for Upper Levels will take place 24-hours after team placements for each Level
 - Re-sort of those that did not get ordered in Round 1
 - Criteria (1) Date of Registration
 - Using top 3 jersey number choices avoiding already taken numbers on that teams roster
 - IF a jersey number choice is not able to be satisfied at this time, then players/parents will be reached out to by your commissioner to ask for an alternate number.





- Order Process and Expectations
 - Practice Jerseys and Game Socks (Handout)
 - As soon as we have firm dates on product arrival from manufacturing we will set-up player pick-up dates at Victoria Rec. Center
 - Game Socks for Upper Levels are in production
 - Round 1 of Game Jerseys for Upper Levels are in production
 - Practice Jerseys for Upper Levels are in production
 - Upper Level Game Jerseys will be handed out in October for those that have arrived
 - NOTE: there will be some players that will be coming in later than others, it's all based on the production schedule and number availability from Round 1 to Round 2
 - Lower Level Team Uniforms is pending production (first week of November is what we are targeting to hand out)
 - NOTE: Tryout Pinnies must be handed in after tryouts, if a pinnie is not confirmed handed in, the Game Jerseys, Socks, Practice Jersey or at the Lower Levels Team Uniform will not be handed out until the pinnie is returned or paid for.
- Reminder, 95%+ of the board, and volunteers are just that VOLUNTEERS and don't get paid. Without the volunteers, things don't run or get done. These volunteers spend time away from their families, jobs, etc. to ensure that all 777 players registered have a first class and fun experience.
- ★ Please be respectful of the volunteers and remember, it's a jersey and a number on a jersey.

Evaluation Check In & Rules

(Highlights Only)

- Pick up Pinny at Check In:
 - Return Pinny after <u>Last</u> Assigned Tryout Session
 - Player responsible for bringing pinny to every session!
 - If Pinnys are not turned in you will not receive a jersey and are responsible for the cost to replace the pinny
- CCHA Colors (Jerseys; Socks; Equipment)
 - No names visible and remove non-CCHA Helmet Stickers
- Neck Guards & Mouth Guards Required (D6/USA Hockey Rule)
- Evaluations are <u>CLOSED</u>
 - Parents are <u>not</u> allowed to observe.
- You are not allowed to be a locker room monitor for your child's tryout level.
- Any player can opt out of the evaluation process and be placed on the C team
 - please notify your Level Commissioner in advance if you plan to opt out.
- Final Team Assignments are Posted after Tryouts End
- Bring Volunteer Check to First Tryout



TRYOUTS



- Tryout Scoring Determines Team Placement
 - Every ice touch is an opportunity to be evaluated
- All Tryout Information posted on CCHA <u>Tryout</u> Webpage.
 - Note: Check the Tryout Page often as information is subject to change.
- All conflicts, illness, or injuries need to be communicated to your Level Commissioner <u>prior</u> to next scheduled tryout session.
- Code of conduct violations during tryouts may result in removal of player from tryouts and scores of ZERO on missed days.
- Tryout Evaluators- Continued Fortis Evaluators Presence

NO Parent is to Interact with Evaluators; Tryout Committee or HDC during tryouts.

 All communications, questions, or concerns are to be directed to your Level Commissioner who will bring in additional resources as necessary.






