- Gambling profit is roughly \$25,000 so far as of January 2024.

- 1st reading of the bylaw change "The bylaws will state that the RRYHA board meeting will be on the 2nd Monday of the month."
- Motion made by Michelle asking if gambling would cover \$2,400 for the squirt B pin trading, Erik seconded the motion. Motion discussed (13 yes-1 NO) MC
- Amanda made a motion asking to cover \$800 of the Squirt A pin trading, Davis seconded the motion. MC
- Michelle made a motion to cover \$800 of the 12UB pin trading, Jeff Hunt seconded motion. MC

New Business

- **President Report:** Goalie Contract proposal for 24-25, 25-26, 26-27 seasons: \$6,500 a year including 15 sessions, 2 hours on ice weekly; dropping classroom and dryland. Erik is going to talk to Derek and see if we could maybe keep the dryland and classroom for the older kids. We need a general liability umbrella policy by State Farm.
- Secretary: Look into getting a new sound system at the Hipp. Brad will talk to the school and city and see if they would be willing to purchase this or split the cost. Carrie will send out an email with the positions that will be open as of May 1, 2024; Vice-President, Secretary, Volunteer Coordinator, Canteen Manager. There is also going to be some appointed positions opening; HOC rep, Scheduler, Arena Facilitator, and Ref Coordinator.

President update:

- D12 had its annual spring meeting. Highlights are as follows:
 - D12 has \$15,956.76 in checking, \$816.28 in savings, \$862.5 in the Tier 1 Rangers
 Account, and \$500 in the Tier 1 Voyageurs account
 - Gamesheet contract has increased to \$10,639, for the 2024/ 2025 season. D12 collected \$5,100 in team fees for the 2023/ 24 season. The board is attempting to acquire a sponsor (Sammy's Pizza) to help with the shortfall, along with increasing team fees.
 - Mr. Carter from Ely motioned to increase team fees for the 2024/25 season to the following:
 - Mites \$100/ team, from \$25/ team
 - Squirts-bantams to \$175/ team, from \$75/ team.
 - Motion 2nd by Jonassen
 - USA hockey is removing the "on-ice" part of officials training
 - D12 open positions:
 - Girls Hockey Coordinator
 - USA Hockey Coach Developer
 - District Hockey Director
 - Spring GM Tier 1 U14 and U15
 - Interested parties should contact Mark Stupar
- Spring 2024 MN Hockey meeting updates:
 - Level 4 coaches will now need continuing ed. to obtain Level 5 certification.
 - Neck protection is required, as of August 1st, 2024, for all players and officials under the age of 18, including J-Gold.
 - The hearing for a player suspension can be waived, if the player/ family of the suspended player requests to waive, in writing.
 - o No player can be registered with 2 hockey associations, at the same time.
 - School waivers must be submitted before the player's 1st of Squirts. This is effective for the 2024/25 season. If the player discontinues attendance at the waivered school, they revert to the association of residence. No discretionary waivers will be approved without a change of residence. Mr. Stupar indicated that players from the Tower attending Cherry School should fill out a waiver for this season.
 - The 1/3 rule for the 13U pilot program will remain unchanged.
 - Every Sanctioned tournament, Squirt and above, requires at least 1 EMT on-site, for all games.
 - Safe Sport

- All teams are required to have Locker Room Monitors in place, with no exceptions for player level.
 - No warnings will be given.
 - 1st offense \$500 team fine, coach suspended for 1 game
 - 2nd offense \$1,000 team fine, coach suspension for 3 games
 - 3rd offense \$2,500 team fine, the coach suspended for the remainder of the season, and the team is banned from District Playoffs.
 - Parents and guardians are not allowed in locker rooms unless Safe Sport Certified and background checked.
 - Other teams around the state do not give Mini-Mites and Mites locker rooms.
 - Bod will discuss more at the June meeting.
 - Locker Room Monitors apply to Open Hockey as well. No exceptions
- Districts will be held February 15-17, Regions February 28-March 2nd.
- D12 will host a "Squirt A District Tournament"
- 2025 District 12 Region host sites:
 - o Greenway- Bantam A
 - o Hibbing-Bantam B
 - Rock Ridge- Bantam AA
 - o Mesabi East- 12UA
- Officials Report:
 - o Registration for Officials closes October 31st, for the 2024/25 season.
 - All Officials seminars will be on-line
 - Associations are encouraged to use 3 Official system, to develop Officials and prepare for Regions/State.
 - USA Hockey Rule Book is good through the 2024/25 season. The following rule changes are being considered for the next cycle of reviews:
 - Delayed off-sides
 - Can Ice the puck, while on the PK
 - Game misconduct in the last 5 minutes of a game will result in the suspension of the following game as well.
 - Motion made by Ely to increase Official's pay by \$5/ game across the board, for the 2024/25 season. 2nd by Greenway, and the motion carried.
 - I-falls made a motion to increase the Official's mileage to \$.60/ mile. 2nd by Grand Rapids, motion carried.
- D12 Fall meeting scheduled for Sept. 25, 2024, at 5 PM, at ITMEC.
 - Scheduler meeting following D12 meeting

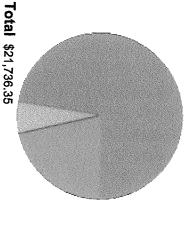

For each 12-month period beginning July 1, a licensed organization will be evaluated by the Gambling Control Board to determine a rating based on the percentage of annual gross profits spent on lawful purpose exponditures it is not a rating of its overall lawful gambling operation.

MONAGEM

An organization that fails to expend a minimum of 30% of gross profits on lawful purposes each year (July to June) is automatically on probation effective July 1 for one year. The organization must increase their rating to a minimum of 30% or be subject to sanctions by the Board.

NOLLABOX

An organization that conducts lawful gambling in a location where the primary business is bingo (bingo hall) must expend a minimum of 20% of gross profits on lawful purposes each year (July to June).

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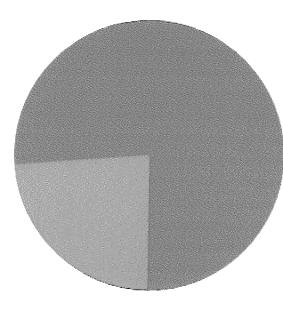

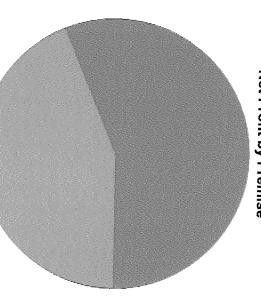

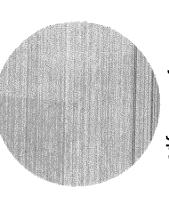

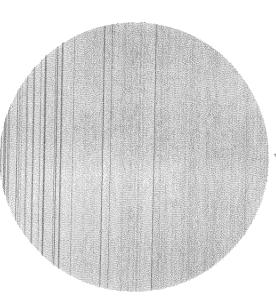

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors Rock Ridge Youth Hockey Association Virginia, Minnesota

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Lawful Gambling Fund of Rock Ridge Youth Hockey Association (a nonprofit organization), which comprise the statement of assets, liabilities, and profit carryover – regulatory basis as of May 31, 2024, and the related statement of revenues, expenses, and changes in profit carryover – regulatory basis for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of the report, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and profit carryover of the Lawful Gambling Fund of Rock Ridge Youth Hockey Association as of May 31, 2024, and the results of its revenues, expenses and changes in profit carryover for the year then ended in accordance with financial reporting practices prescribed by Minnesota Statute 349 as described in Note 1.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

The Organization conducts electronic gaming. The distributor of these games electronically calculates the fees, receipts, and prizes paid as a service organization. We were unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to ensure the accuracy of the data provided by the service organization.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Rock Ridge Youth Hockey Association and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. As described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the financial statements are prepared in accordance with the financial reporting practices prescribed by Minnesota Statute 349, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, to meet the requirements of Minnesota Revenue and the Minnesota Gambling Control Board. As a result, the financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the financial reporting practices prescribed in Minnesota Statute 349. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud
 or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include
 examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that
 are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS May 31, 2024

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Organization

The Rock Ridge Youth Hockey Association commenced lawful gambling operations in 2023. During the year ended May 31, 2024, the Organization had one (1) permitted gambling operation site to increase its program services and thereby better serve the community. The site which had activity during the past year was Sawmill Saloon & Restaurant.

The Organization has a valid charitable gambling license which allows it to conduct the following forms of gambling: paper pull-tabs, electronic pull-tabs, electronic bingo, tipboards, sports tipboards, paddletickets, bingo, and raffles. The forms of lawful gambling conducted by the Organization during the year ended May 31, 2024 were paper pull-tab, electronic bingo, raffles, and electronic pull-tabs. Revenues in excess of allowable expenses generated by the Lawful by Minnesota Statutes.

Basis of Presentation

The regulatory basis of accounting is the basis of accounting prescribed by Minnesota Revenue, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. The regulatory basis of accounting differs from the accrual method of accounting in that under the regulatory method, substantially all costs are expensed when paid. Also, under the regulatory method, the cost of equipment is expensed, whereas under U.S. generally accepted accounting principles, such expenditures are capitalized and depreciated over the asset's estimated useful life.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the regulatory basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash - Starting Game Banks

Starting game banks consist of imprest amounts which are used to fund open play of games. The Organization maintained starting cash banks for the paper pull-tabs games at Sawmill Saloon & Restaurant site for 2024 of \$4,000.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS May 31, 2024

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Electronic Games - Pull-tabs

During 2024, the Organization conducted electronic pull-tabs at Sawmill Saloon & Restaurant.

At the end of each session, the net receipts in excess of the starting bank are deposited. Net disbursements are carried over and occasionally reimbursed. A report is provided by the distributor of the electronic games which includes the expected net receipts or disbursements for the games played. Cash long and short is allocated to games played during the session. At the end of each month a report is provided by the distributor which calculates the commission and prize amounts due, which are paid electronically by the Organization.

NOTE 2 - LIQUIDITY AND AVAILABILITY OF FINANCIAL ASSETS

At May 31, 2024, the Organization had \$23,887 of financial assets available within one year of the statement of financial position date to meet cash needs for general operating expenditures, consisting of cash of \$23,887.

NOTE 3 - FINANCIAL PRESENTATION

While the financial statements – regulatory basis may have the appearance of presenting the complete financial position of Rock Ridge Youth Hockey Association, only the assets, liabilities, and profit carryover and revenue and expenses of its Lawful Gambling Fund are included.

NOTE 4 - INVENTORIES

The Organization expenses the cost of game purchases, including sales tax, on the cash basis. In addition, the Organization maintains a perpetual inventory of games on hand. These games are extended at cost excluding sales tax. Physical inventory consists of the following at May 31, 2024.

NOTE 5 - COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

The Organization leases spaces at one (1) site of its lawful gambling activities within and near the City of Virginia, Minnesota. The lease agreement requires rent based on a percentage of gross profits at the site, at 15%. Rent expense for the year ended May 31, 2024 was \$18,230. This lease can be terminated by either party with a written 30 day notice.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS May 31, 2024

NOTE 5 - COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES (CONTINUED)

The Organization leases electronic gaming devices. The lease payments are based on a percentage of sales and can be terminated by either party with a 30 day notice. Total payments for the year ended May 31, 2024 was \$22,325.

NOTE 6 - INCOME TAXES

The Organization is exempt from state and federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code; however, it is required to pay state and federal income taxes on unrelated business income. Under the regulatory method, these taxes are expensed when paid.

As of May 31, 2024, the Organization has not been audited by the Internal Revenue Service, and accordingly, the unrelated business income tax returns for the past three and one-half years are open to examination.

NOTE 7 - RESULTS OF GAME TESTING

Subsequent to May 31, 2024, the Organization's independent auditor's selected 10 pull-tab games from all sites active during the year, including games with unsold tickets. No exceptions were noted.

Subsequent to May 31, 2024, the organization's independent auditor's reviewed and tested all raffles games played. We noted that there is a raffle game with twenty (20) unaccounted for unsold tickets.

NOTE 8 - CASH ON HAND

On August 14, 2024, the cash on hand and inventory of games was observed by two members of the Organization that were directly involved in the Organization's gambling activities who have been appointed by the Board. Cash on hand of \$5,435 was counted, of which \$4,000 represents starting game banks.

NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

In preparing these financial statements, the Organization has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through October 21, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Accordingly, had we performed additional procedures, other matters may have come to our attention regarding the Organization's noncompliance with the above-referenced terms, covenants, provisions, or conditions of the indenture, insofar as they relate to accounting matters.

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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT ON INTERNAL CONTROL OVER FINANCIAL REPORTING

To the Board of Directors Rock Ridge Youth Hockey Association Virginia, Minnesota

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements - regulatory basis of the Lawful Gambling Fund of Rock Ridge Youth Hockey Association as of and for the year ended May 31, 2024, in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, we considered Rock Ridge Youth Hockey Association's system of internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements - regulatory basis, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Organization's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Organization's internal control. Our report on the financial statements - regulatory basis is qualified because the Organization sells electronic pull-tabs. As service organizations, the distributors of these games electronically calculate the fees, receipts and prizes paid. We were unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to ensure the accuracy of the data provided by the service organizations.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the preceding paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and, therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified. However, as discussed below, we identified a certain deficiency in internal control that we consider to be a material weakness and another deficiency that we consider to be a significant deficiency.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the Organization's financial statements - regulatory basis will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. We consider the following deficiency in the Lawful Gambling Fund of Rock Ridge Youth Hockey Association's internal control to be a material weakness.

Lack of Control Over the Financial Reporting Process

Management is responsible for establishing and maintaining internal controls, including monitoring, and for the fair presentation in the financial statements of the assets, liabilities and profit carryover, and revenues and expenses and changes in its profit carryover, including the notes to the financial statements, in accordance with the regulatory basis which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

At times, management may choose to outsource certain accounting functions due to cost or training considerations. Such accounting functions and service providers must be governed by the control policies and procedures of the Organization. Management is as responsible for outsourced functions performed by a service provider as it is for your personnel.

Management is also responsible for management decisions and functions; for designating an individual with suitable skill, knowledge, or experience to oversee any outsourced services and for evaluating the adequacy and results of those services and accepting responsibility for them.

As part of the audit, management requested that the auditor prepare a draft of the lawful gambling fund financial statements — regulatory basis, including the related notes to financial statements. Management reviewed, approved, and accepted responsibility for those financial statements prior to their issuance; however, management does not possess the technical expertise to comply with financial reporting accounting standards. The absence of this control procedure is considered a material weakness because the potential exists that a material misstatement of the financial statements could occur and not be prevented or detected by the Organization's internal control.

A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance. We consider the following deficiency in the Lawful Gambling Fund of Rock Ridge Youth Hockey Association's internal control to be a significant deficiency.

Segregation of Duties

Due to the limited number of personnel within the Organization, the segregation of accounting functions necessary to ensure adequate internal accounting control is not possible. The concentration of duties and responsibilities in a limited number of individuals is not desirable from an internal accounting control point of view.

The existence of material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may already be known to management and may represent a conscious decision by management or those charged with governance to accept that degree of risk because of cost or other considerations. Management is responsible for making decisions concerning costs to be incurred and related benefits. We are responsible to communicate material weaknesses and significant deficiencies in accordance with professional standards regardless of management's decisions.

An organization that fails to expend a minimum of 30% of gross profits on lawful purposes each year (July to June) is automatically on probation effective July 1 for one year. The organization must increase their rating to a mininum of 30% or be subject to sanctions by the Board.

EXCEPTION

An organization that conducts lawful gambling in a location where the primary business is bingo (bingo hall) must expend a minimum of 20% of gross profits on lawful purposes each year (July to June).

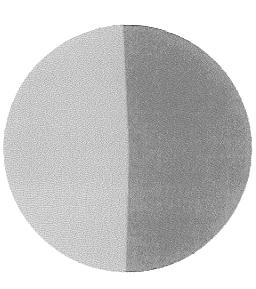

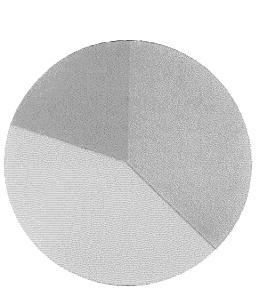
