Coaches Code of Conduct

Mission and Purpose: MCCC is dedicated to raising the standard of service to youth in sports through the creation and enforcement of the Code of Conduct. The Code of Conduct defines the expectations for coaches. MCCC firmly believes that the sports experience is to be a positive, safe, and enjoyable learning experience for youth of the league.

I WILL:

1. Place the emotional and physical well-being of my players ahead of a personal desire to win.
2. Treat each player as an individual and expect age-appropriate skills from all my players.
3. Direct my players at all times to play by the rules and to show respect for the other players, coaches, and officials.
4. Do my best to provide a safe playing situation for my players.
5. Teach my players in a positive, nurturing manner. I will not berate, intimidate or bully my players into learning.
6. Lead by example in demonstrating fair play and sportsmanship to all my players on and off the court.
7. Exhibit respect for other coaches and officials.
8. Speak with other coaches and officials in a civil, calm manner.
9. Not openly berate, taunt, or otherwise comment negatively on the other coaches or officials.
10. Remember that I am a youth sports coach and that the game is for the children and not the adults.
11. Adhere to the Coach's Code of Conduct while participating in any activity related to this league.
12. Do Not use vulgar or discriminating vocabulary at any time.
13. Abide by the guidelines and policies of the facilities where I practice and play games which are set by MCCC and/or the School District.
14. Read and abide by MCCC rules and policies as directed by the league I am coaching.

In the event a coach is deemed to not comply with this code of conduct, the following will occur:

1st offense: Verbal Warning from the MCCC Board

2nd offense: Written Warning from the MCCC Board and suspension from 1 tournament

3rd offense: Incidence is reviewed by the MCCC Board with a suspension and possible dismissal from the program for the Coach.

****If ejected from a game:**

1st ejection:

- The Board directs that the coach remove himself/herself from the tournament and facility immediately. The coach will not coach for the remainder of the tournament. The coach must notify the MCCC board member by the Monday following the weekend tournament.
- The coach must meet with members of the board before they are allowed to coach at the next scheduled tournament.

- The coach is automatically suspended from (cannot coach) the next tournament.

2nd ejection

- The Board directs that the coach remove himself/herself from the tournament and facility immediately. The coach will not coach for the remainder of the tournament.
- The coach must notify the MCCC board member by the Monday following the weekend tournament.
- The Coach is dismissed as a coach for the season. It is at the Board's discretion whether the coach can coach the following year.
