

## MCCC Code of Conduct Players, Parents/Guardians and Families

- 1. This Code of Conduct applies to all MCCC participants and parents/guardians, and all family members, friends, relatives, etc. It is the responsibility of all parents/guardians to inform family, friends, relatives, etc. of this Code of Conduct and to help control unruly behavior. You are representing the community of Monticello and our basketball programs.
- 2. I will respect the game, the officials, the opponent, and all the fans.
- 3. I will refrain from the use of profanity and "trash talk".
- 4. I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, officials, and contest administrators at every game.
- 5. I will place the emotional and physical well-being of teammates and opponents ahead of my personal desire to win.
- 6. I will treat other players, coaches, fans, and officials with respect regardless of race, gender creed or ability.
- 7. I will promote a sports environment that is free from drugs, tobacco, and alcohol, and I will refrain from their use at all MCCC sporting events.
- 8. I will do my best to remember that youth sports are about having FUN and that winning and losing is part of everyone's experience.
- 9. I will express my concerns through the proper channels in a dignified manner.
- 10. I will respect the volunteers who are assisting with the conduct of MCCC events.
- 11. I will respect and adhere to the rules governing eligibility and competition.

Any violation of this code of conduct may result in temporary or permanent banishment from any or all future MCCC events, including temporary or permanent removal of child(ren) participants from the MCCC program.

Please remember that you are representing the community of Monticello and Monticello basketball. Profanity and inappropriate or unruly behavior WILL NOT be tolerated.

When registering and electronically signing during registration, we are verifying that we have read and agree to abide by the Code of Conduct and these MCCC policies. We understand the consequences that may occur should we violate them.

Acceptance of the Code of Conduct is required to register. If you do not comply, the player will not be allowed to practice or play until accepted.
