 - There are AEDs available at every field where baseball is scheduled to be played or practiced. Some sites share a blue box so one A.E.D. is located there.
 - Please be careful when storing equipment as to not damage the A.E.D. or its case.

- Concussions and the Law
 - Please scan in and keep with you a copy of the concussion training certificate. It is good for a 3 year time period. Send the scanned copy to C.I.C.B.

 - You can also take the Concussion training from the CDC for free. Launch the course on the right.

Reporting Innings Pitched

10U Pitching Restrictions

A pitcher may pitch a maximum of TWO innings per game or scrimmage, and a maximum of SIX innings per week. Violation of this rule will be subject to review by the CICB Board and could result in a potential forfeiture of the game(s) in guestion or a coach's ejection.

Submit "innings pitched" of *BOTH TEAMs*. Coaches must submit the jersey number and number of innings pitched for each player who pitches during a game.

Coaches must submit "innings pitched" within 24 hours after each Coaches must submit "innings pitched" within 24 hours after game is completed.

DEFINITIONS: A week consists of Monday through Sunday.

Note - One pitch in an inning constitutes ONE inning pitched.

12U Pitching Restrictions

A pitcher may pitch a maximum of THREE innings per game or scrimmage, and a maximum of SIX innings per week. Violation of this rule will be subject to review by the CICB Board and could result in a potential forfeiture of the game(s) in question or a coach's ejection.

Submit "innings pitched" of *BOTH TEAMs*. Coaches must submit the jersey number and number of innings pitched for each player who pitches during a game.

 Sandquist Multi-Use #2 & 3 on Thursdays @ 6pm
- Flexibility on the fly is a must
 - Fields will change and days may change.
 - Be supportive and communicate well with your parents.
 - Community Ed permits since March, and they always change without notice.
 - Please handle yourself well with others if they are at a field and wait patiently.

Game Score Reporting

It is the duty of the both coaches of each game to report the score of the game. Please update your game score on the google form found in your email or link on the website

- If scores are not reported within 7 days they will be listed as 0-0 ties
 - This will be monitored and enforced in 2025
- Thank you in advance for your prompt attention to this detail

Weather Cancellations

- Every effort will be made to play every scheduled game. If in-house games need to be postponed due to weather C.I.C.B. will send a mass email to everyone between 5:00 -5:15 pm, and we will make an informational post on Facebook and our website. If C.I.C.B. cancels/postpones games C.I.C.B. will notify umpires and reschedule games.
- If games are not cancelled prior start of play, the first priority should be for player and spectators' safety. If there is thunder and/or lightning in the area all games MUST be delayed for 30 minutes after the last event.
- It is up to the Travel coach to connect with the opposing teams coach to cancel or reschedule a game because of weather, if a CICB field is not playable and we know in advance we will let you know and you will contact the opposing teams coach.

Make-up Games

- Every effort will be made to schedule make-up games
- Many factors determine if a make-up game can be played
 - Field availability
 - Umpire availability
 - Occurrence within the season
 - Have we played our "standard" number of games?
- Player and spectator safety is always first when cancelling games
- School events and other such factors affect when games can be played
- Flexibility and weekend dates are needed to make-up games

Tournament Seeding and Set-up

- The tournament will be seeded by regular season winning percentage.
- If there is a tie the following process will be used to determine seed.
 - 1. Head-to-Head competition
 - 2. Least runs allowed
 - o 3. Coin flip
- The tournament format will be double elimination.
- Weather will dictate a change of schedule and format.
- End of Year tournament is Friday, June 27, 2025 Sunday, June 29, 2025

Parent Communication

- Parent communication is key to a successful season
- Do not be afraid of over communication
- Set up a group text message, email contact list, a Facebook group,
 REMIND app, game changer. These are all easy ways to send instant communication
- Please be supportive, of the organization, in your communications
 - Understand that we are all volunteers that make the organization run
 - Good communication diffuses most conflict
 - Many times, decisions are made for all 300 + players and families instead of just a few people
- Weekly updates and calendars are essential to running a successful team
- Find a parent volunteer that is willing to help with this

Coach and Parent Decorum

- I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, officials and association representatives at all times
- I will remember that my child plays baseball for his enjoyment, not mine
- I will demand and honor that all players, coaches, officials, volunteers and spectators are treated with respect regardless of race, gender, creed or ability
- I will respect the officials and their authority. I will not argue with or criticize game officials

Coach and Parent Decorum

- I will respect the coaches for their decisions and leave the coaching to the coaches
- I will not engage in the use of profanity, obscene language or improper actions
- I will make every effort to get my child to practice and games on time
- I will not post negative comments on any form of social media directed towards coaches, players, other parents, or members of C.I.C.B.

Walk Up Music & Music in General

- Teams may play music prior to the games and during player walkup
- All music must be appropriate for all ages
- No foul language
- No explicit content
- Head coaches must maintain all team music is consistent with the Code of Conduct

- The Trusted Coaches program is delivered exclusively online (promoting 100% compliance) and provides the opportunity for a coach to complete the program at their own pace in the comfort of their own home.
- All coaches and assistants MUST complete the training and background check, along
 with claiming a role in trusted coaches. If you plan to have any additional helpers or a
 team manager (bookkeeper/game changer person) in the dugout, they must do the
 training too. Only 4 people in the dugout for ANY game (Head coach, 2 assistants and
 a team manager)
