<p><b>IAHA Guidebook PLAYERS MOVING to ANOTHER AGE CLASSIFICATION (Page 13-15):</b></p> <p>a. 8U Players Playing Up - Having 8U players play up at 10U is strongly discouraged but may be allowed when there are compelling reasons to do so. Each association, at their discretion, may allow up to three (3) 8U players per season to play up at the 10U division for the season.</p> <p>i. Additional players playing up may be considered with an exception request to the Affiliate ADM Coordinator and play up committee, who will only consider the request if it's due to association needs, i.e., having to merge age divisions in order to have a functional program.</p> <p>b. 10U Players Playing Up - Having 10U players play up at 12U is strongly discouraged but occasionally there are compelling reasons to do so. Each association, at their discretion, may allow up to three 10U players per season to play up at the 12U division for the season.</p> <p>i. Additional players playing up may be considered with an exception request to the Affiliate ADM Coordinator and play up committee, who will only consider the request if it's due to association needs, i.e. having to merge age divisions in order to have a functional program.</p> <p>c. If the applicable local program's rules or decisions permit a player to do so, a player may play up one age group (second year player to next age group only) without ADM/play up committee approval. This exception shall not apply to the Youth Tier I 15-only (15O) age classification as this classification shall be limited to only players age 15 (as defined in the birth year age classification chart for the current season). This exception also will not apply to a player 12 years of age moving to a 14U category or older.</p> <p>d. If the applicable local program's rules or decisions permit a player to do so, players 14 years of age (14U) according to USA Hockey birth year classification, may participate in the 18U or 19U age classification if their current organization does not have a 16U age classification team.</p> <p>e. No player 12 years of age or younger (12U, defined in the USA Hockey age classification chart for the current season) is eligible to play in a game that allows checking without prior approval from the Affiliate ADM Coordinator and committee. Only players that are 12 years old before December 31 may be considered to play up from non-check to check. It will be at the discretion of the committee to ascertain if there is a need to fulfill a team or if the player has the appropriate ability. These players would ONLY be allowed to participate on a house/rec team that is not National Bound.</p> <p>f. A 12U player may move to a 14U girls team to round out a team. It will be at the discretion of the play up committee as to ascertain if there is a need to fulfill a team to compete at the house/rec level. NO 12U player may play or be rostered on a team that will be national bound and participate in a state, district, or national tournament.</p> <p>i. Additional players playing up may be considered with an exception request to the Affiliate ADM Coordinator and committee, who will only consider the request if it's due to association needs, i.e. having to merge age divisions in order to have a functional program.</p> <p>g. No player 13 years (as defined in the USA Hockey age classification chart for the current season) is eligible to play in an 18U or 19U age classification without prior approval from the Affiliate ADM Coordinator and the play up committee.</p> <p>h. The District Registrar is the only person that can approve a player to play down an age classification. Waivers to play down an age classification are granted for medical reasons and not for lack of playing ability or skills level experience. If a waiver is approved, the player would not be allowed to play in any State, Regional or National Championships. In order for a waiver to be approved, the following documentation is required:</p> <p>i. A letter from the parents requesting the waiver; ii. A letter from a medical doctor stating the medical reasons for the waiver; iii. Approval letter from the Local Association; iv. Approval letter from the State affiliate; v. The above documentation package should be sent to the Rocky Mountain District Registrar for consideration and approval.</p>
