1. Playing as an alternate is a privilege not offered to everyone as you get experience at the next level of hockey and extra ice-time.
2. There is a CHC imposed 9 game maximum for alternate players. It is the responsibility of the coaching staff to keep track of the number of CHC games played up so as to avoid violating this CHC rule. Non-CHC games do not count towards the 9 game CHC limit.
3. In the event of a conflict, games for the team in which you are a full-time rostered player are the priority. If there is a need on the alternate (higher division) team and an agreement between the alternate (higher division) head coach and your current head coach, that your full-time team will not suffer in your absence, you may play up and miss your regularly scheduled game.
3. Playing as an alternate should not set expectations to be rostered permanently on the team. An alternate is an extra player needed to fill out roster spots on an intermittent basis for numerous reasons. Any player movement discussions will come from direct communication with the coaching staff. No expectations should arise otherwise.
