- WSHA received it's USA Hockey affiliation through CAHA
- Junior Seahawks brand assets transferred from Wilmington Ice House
- Assumed management of operations from the Wilmington Ice House

WHAT DOES TIER 2 MEAN?

- Field teams in the A and AA designations
- All 13U through 18U teams will be national bound
 - -Team must play in min. 20 games
 - -Players must play in min. 10 games
 - -Must declare by October 15th
- National bound teams will compete in the NC State Championships
- Winners will advance to the USA Hockey Tier 2 National Championships

ONICE

PUT IN THE WORK

Pre-Season Development Camp - August 7-11

Kickoff the season (5 sessions)

Practices - Week of August 14th

- Twice a week (52 sessions)
- 10U and 12U shared ice
- 14U and 16U full ice

Skill Sessions

- Bi-weekly (13 sessions)
 - Led by consultant coaches and head coaches



OFF ICE

CHANGE THE GAME

Change the Game - Official Off Ice Partner

- Access to app based training program
 - 1. Age appropriate strength and conditioning
 - 2. Skill development
- Opportunity to add components (additional costs)
 - 1. Baseline assessment
 - 2. In-person strength and conditioning
 - 3. Sports nutritionist
 - 4. Physical therapy
 - 5. Skill development

Exhibition - 12 Games

- Compete against quality competition with like minded associations
- Freedom to be creative with format and locations
- Maximize travel opportunities by playing more than 2 games per weekend

Number of Teams

No set number - Multiple teams

Level of Competition

- A or AA?? Doesn't matter
 - Difficult to establish criteria for A or AA for younger age groups
 - Customized approach to foster strong competition
 - CHL play-in tournament ensure correct placement
 - EJEPL Allow for adjustments
 - Tournaments select correct division
- All teams will have equal access and opportunity
 - No Teal team format going forward

Number of Teams

One team per age group

Level of Competition

- Each team will be:
 - AA
 - Independent
 - National bound to compete for state championship
 - EJEPL allow for adjustments
 - Tournaments select correct division



SEASON COSTS

APPROXIMATE COSTS

10U and 12U teams - Shared Ice Practices

Range: \$ 2515 - \$3015 (2022 costs: \$1950)

14U and 16U teams - Full Ice Practices

Range: \$ 3160 - \$3790 (2022 costs: \$2500)

Factors

- All operational costs went up from last year
- Number of teams
- Number of total players
- Number of players per team



PARENT INVOLVEMENT

- Fundraising
