HOW TO TALK TO UMPIRES

- Always maintain a level of respect. Umpires will get calls wrong.
- All expectations for the game should be set in the pre game meeting

- Introduce yourself
- Adapt, each umpire will have a different strike zone and possibly interpret
 the rules a little differently. Umpires tend to call low and outside strikes. Try
 hitting pitches like this in practice for when the time arises...

HOW TO DISCUSS CALLS

- The best way to discuss calls is to first, call time.
- Once time is granted approach the umpire.
- Only the head coach should address the umpire.
- The best time to discuss calls is in between innings.
- Ask for clarification on the details of a rule.
- Understand the umpire will get calls wrong from time to time.
- Refrain from discussing strike zone. Even if you are looking for a bigger zone, this can lead to misunderstandings.

FEEDBACK

- Feedback is very important so we can improve our services to you.
- If we have a good umpire, we want to know so we can have them return
- If we have a bad umpire, we want to know so we can work on improvement or restrict them for your games.
- Hustle, Timeliness, Attitude, Rules knowledge, Time Limits... These are all situations that we can accumulate information on our umpires.
- Do not share your observation with the umpire, share it with the hotline.
 (Acknowledging the umpire is good or bad can lead to conflict,
 Overconfidence is real with umpires)
