Mite/8U Structure

Mites (Boys) and Girls (8U) will play separate from one another, but structure is similar:

- Gold: Typically, 4th year skaters (2016/2017 birth years)
- Blue: Typically, 3rd year skaters (2017/2018 birth years)
- Silver: Boys only. Typically, 2nd year skaters (2018/2019 birth years)
- Junior Knights/Junior Hawks: Multi-age skaters 1st/2nd year, Kindergarten and Pre-k





- Skills clinics starting this weekend, 10/11
- Rookie camp starting this weekend, 10/11
- Evaluations for returning players will start the weekend of 11/1.
- No evaluations for Rookie players (Junior Knights/Junior Hawks).
- Practice for Junior Knights/Junior Hawks will begin weekend of 11/1.
- Times for both evaluations and practices will be emailed out.



Team Formations

- Gold/Blue Teams: Formed by November 12th.
- Silver/Junior Knights/ Junior Hawks Teams: formed around the same time.
- After teams are established, communications will be coming through the Crossbar app.



Practices & Games

- Early season focused on development.
- Practices follow USA Hockey guidelines.
- Scrimmages are primarily half-ice and cross-ice.
- Silver, Junior Knights and Junior Hawks Levels: one game and one practice on weekends.
- Blue Level: one game and one practice on weekends
- **Gold Level**: one game and one practice on weekends. Will have halfice scrimmages with equal level teams from nearby associations and play up to 10 full ice games.
 - There maybe one weeknight practice when ice is available, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday nights.



- Helmet with full face cage or shield.
 - Have players name on the front of their helmet
- Neck Guard: A standalone or neck guard shirt that provides protection around the neck.
- Shoulder Pads
- Elbow Pads
- Gloves
- Hockey Breezers
- Hockey Shin Guards
- Mouthguard
- Protective Cup
- Hockey Skates
- Hockey Stick

- USA Hockey Background check must be completed every 2 years.
- 3. SafeSport Training

- Must complete each season.
- STMAYHA will receive confirmation of SafeSport completion through USA Hockey.

Please see the chart below for SafeSport completion status and expiration as well as Background Screen completion. If you have not submitted your Parent USA Hockey number for the 2025-26 Season, you must complete 2025-26 Volunteer Registration. If you feel your status has been incorrectly reported, first check the date that this page was last updated to ensure you are looking at the most up to date report. If you still have concerns, reach out to MemberServices@usahockey.org. (Please note, background screens may take up to two (2) weeks from submission to be available to our registration team via our USA Hockey report.)

Volunteer Policy

The <u>St. Michael - Albertville Youth Hockey | 2025-26 VOLUNTEER POLICY</u> is in effect from May 1, 2025, through April 30, 2026, aligning with STMAYHA's fiscal year. All opportunities throughout the season are posted on the <u>website</u>.

- Families must complete 12 hours/per player association volunteer hours; this does not include team volunteer shifts.
- Families will have the option to buy out their volunteer hours at registration and will be charged \$1,200 per player. If association volunteer hours
- Failure to meet requirements by the end of the fiscal year will result in \$1,200 charged per player to the credit card on file.
- In the instance volunteer hours are not completed and the credit card on file doesn't clear, a new credit card must be provided or the player will NOT be allowed to register for the upcoming season.
- ➤ Players that withdraw from hockey or are injured during the season will still face volunteer requirements. Circumstances are reviewed on a case-by-case basis which takes into account the date of player removal.
- Checks will not be held or accepted for the volunteer policy, only credit cards.

<u>No Show Policy:</u> If you are signed up for a volunteer shift (Gambling or Regular) and do not complete that shift, for whatever reason, your will be charged (canceling a volunteer shift within 48 hours will result in a no-show fee):

1st offense – \$100**
2nd offense – \$250**
3rd offense - full volunteer requirement amount of 1,200**

Minnesota Hockey's Waiver Requirement

Per MN Hockey's current Participation Policy, players must participate with the association whose boundaries incorporate either the player's residence or the school the player attends. If a player lives outside of an association's boundaries but open-enrolls in a school within that association's boundaries, a School Attendance Waiver and proof of enrollment must be on file.

- If your player is currently open-enrolled in a STMA school and does not have a School Attendance Waiver and proof of enrollment on file, please contact President Adam Frost @ president@stmayha.org as soon as possible.
- Please be advised that if your player lives outside the STMA School District and is either homeschooled or is enrolled in STMA Online, your player must play for their association of residence.
- School Attendance Waivers and proof of enrollment must be updated anytime an open enrolled player changes schools (i.e., primary to elementary, elementary to middle school, middle school to high school).
- District 10 Director requires proof of enrollment to be submitted to her each season whether an open enrolled player has changed schools or not. Thus, if you live in the Rogers School District, please send proof of enrollment (i.e., copy of school schedule) to President Adam Frost @ president@stmayha.org.



Parent/Legal Guardian Code of Conduct



STMAYHA's <u>Parent/Legal Guardian Code of Conduct Policy</u> is adapted from USA Hockey's "Zero Tolerance" *Please be advised that non-compliance will result in sanctioned consequences*.

Because our children learn from our example, we need to exemplify the highest level of sportsmanship by supporting all players, coaches, team managers, referees, and parents.

- > No inappropriate yelling at or actions towards players, coaches, officials, arena personnel, volunteers, parents or spectators. Parents/legal guardians who are hostile or otherwise act inappropriately in any arena or via email, phone call, text message, written/typed letter, or any social media avenue may be subject to disciplinary action by the STMAYHA Executive Board.
- > Observe the 24-hour rule: No parent/legal guardian, or relative of any STMAYHA player, in a fit of frustration/anger over a player's ice time/position, coaches' play of a player, and/or team status per STMAYHA's tryout policy will contact the coach, level coordinator, or any other member of the STMAYHA Board of Directors within 24 hours. This includes email, phone call, text message, written/typed letter, or any social media avenue.
