OCTOBER PULSE SURVEY

Thanks so much to the families that filled out our October Pulse Survey! We had 81 respondents, which is terrific for our first time sending out this type of survey specific to the 14ers experience this season.

Across all age levels, families reported extremely high satisfaction with the overall experience.

Key strengths included:

the ice.

Outstanding coaching: Many of you highlighted the effort, communication, and passion our coaches bring daily. Several teams received exceptional praise for player development, motivation, and creating a positive, structured learning environment. Strong team connection and sportsmanship: Players feel connected, supported, and proud to be a 14er, with teams demonstrating strong respect and culture both on and off

High-quality development: On-ice instruction, systems learning, and overall player growth were repeatedly mentioned as standout strengths.

Positive manager communication: Most families feel well informed and supported by their managers throughout the season.

Families consistently shared that their players are developing confidence and truly enjoying hockey. Across age groups, many parents mentioned that their daughters are happier, more motivated, and more confident this season. This speaks to the environment the coaches, managers, and families are helping create, one that builds both skill and love for the game.

Areas We Will Continue to Improve

Your feedback also highlighted important opportunities, and we are committed to addressing them:

- More consistency and advance notice for scheduling, especially around late practices, added sessions, and shared ice.
- Clarity around off-ice expectations, including age-appropriate conditioning, avoiding excessive fatigue, and limiting multi-team overlap when possible.

Continued...

- Greater transparency around team finances, with clearer breakdowns for travel, tournaments, and fee planning.
- Refinement of coaching communication styles where needed.
- Creating more alignment and consistency across teams in how skills sessions, dryland, and video work are structured.
- Families shared that some teams have robust off-ice and skills programs while others have little or none, and expectations aren't always clear.

We appreciate the honesty and thoughtfulness in all the feedback. It helps us prioritize where to direct our attention and how we can make meaningful improvements throughout the season.

A second Pulse Survey will be sent in January and a final Survey sent in mid to late March.


Comments related to specific coaches/managers/treasuers will be shared with those individuals directly.



We want to ensure that you are able to get answers to all your questions throughout the season. These are your point people and their areas of responsibility:

Coaches: Coaching, competition, and player development

Team Manager: Communication, fundraising, social events, team travel arrangements, minor official staffing (scoreboard/scoresheet/penalty box), Tier II team paperwork gathering/compilation (if applicable)

Team Treasurer: Bookkeeping (calculation/collection/management/tracking of team fees)

Level Representatives: Conduit between the team managers/coaches and the Colorado 14ers director, responsible for planning and execution of 14ers all club activities, coordination of manager and treasurer activities to share best practices and ensure all required activities are completed (SafeSport training, monthly accounting submission, etc.)

Colorado 14ers Director: Overall 14ers program responsibility

As a reminder, the 24 hour rule applies for any complaints:

Parents may not approach or contact a coach, team manager, level representative, segment leader, or other LHA staff member to voice complaints or displeasure with coaching decisions during or immediately following a game or practice. Parents must wait a minimum of twenty-four (24) hours before initiating contact or communication with such individuals.

Coaches, team managers, level representatives, segment leaders, or LHA staff members may not approach or contact a parent to voice complaints or displeasure during or immediately following a game or practice. Such individuals must also wait a minimum of twenty-four (24) hours before initiating contact or communication with a parent; provided, however, that such 24-hour period does not apply to electronic communications in which a parent is copied pursuant to the Social Media and Electronic Communication Policy.
